### **FREE SCHOOL MEAL**

You may be able to receive meals for your child(ren) and a clothing voucher of £60 if you are in receipt of any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)



### STUDENTS' EXCELLENT ACHIEVEMENTS

Woodside High School students have achieved strong results in this year's GCSE examinations with 69% of students achieving 5 GCSEs at grades 4+ including English and Maths and 43% at grades 5+ including English and Maths.

Exceptional results include those by Patrica Ssonko (eleven grade 9s); Mohammad Hayen (six grade 9s and one grade 8), Ibtissam Ijouiher (six grade 9s, three grade 8s, and two grade 7s); Natalia Antova (four grade 9s, four grade 7s and three grade 8s), Jabiah Murshida (four grade 9s and six grade 8s), Tahir Ibis (four grade 9s, one grade 8 and three grade 7s), and Jerome Iyamu who achieved four grade 9s.

With 70% of students achieving 5 or more 9-4 grades and progress for all learners well above average; Woodside students have once again demonstrated why, Woodside High School is a fantastic place for students to study and learn.



### COVID MOVEMENTS AROUND School

Students had 50 minutes for lunch this week (Year 7-1 hour) this was to get them through the canteen. However, this has now been speeded up and means we have a large number of students together at lunch.

This will minimalise numbers at the school gate and reduce potential spreading of the virus.



#### UPDATES ON VACCINATION AND SCHOOL TESTING

Dear parents, carers, staff and students,

As we begin to prepare for the return to schools and colleges in September, please see some important public health updates below:

#### Vaccinations for 16- and 17-year-olds

As you may know, the NHS is now inviting 16- and 17-year-olds to attend for their first dose of COVID-19 vaccination. We would strongly encourage anyone who is eligible to attend for their vaccine, as vaccination remains the most effective way to protect ourselves and our communities.

16- and 17-year-olds will be able to access a vaccination in the following ways:

- A link will be sent via text message to a website where they can book their appointment via a local service (such as a GP surgery or a walk-in centre). N.B. Those aged 16 and 17 cannot use the NHS adult online booking system, so must wait for their specific link if they wish to book an appointment.
- There <u>are also two walk-in vaccination centres</u> in the borough which offer vaccination to those aged 16-17 where appointment is not needed. These are:
  - o Bounds Green Health Centre, 1A Gordon Road, N11 2PA
  - o Lordship Lane Primary Care Centre, 239 Lordship Lane, N17 6AA
  - You can also put your postcode into the <u>NHS vaccination site finder</u> and find a site offering vaccination to those aged 16 or over.

Those aged 12 to 17 with specific underlying health conditions that put them at risk of severe COVID-19, or who live with an extremely vulnerable person will be also offered two doses of the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine and will be invited in the same way as the 16 and 17-year-olds.

#### Testing before returning to school

- Before returning to school in September, all secondary school pupils should receive <u>2 on-site</u> <u>lateral flow device tests</u>, <u>3 to 5 days apart</u>. Settings may commence testing from 3 working days before the start of term and can stagger return of pupils across the first week to manage this. Pupils should then continue to test twice weekly at home until the end of September, when this will be reviewed by the Government.
- Staff should undertake twice weekly home tests whenever they are on site until the end of September, when this will also be reviewed.

If your child is transferring to secondary school in September 2021, and you live in Haringey, you can also apply for a one-off clothing grant of £60. The closing date for a clothing grant is 31 March 2022.

Due to the disruption caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, the closing date for children who transferred to secondary school in September 2020 has been extended to **31 August 2021**.

You do not need to send us evidence of your benefits at this stage - we'll let you know if we need more information.
