Dear Parents and Carers,

Firstly - thank you for all the amazing good deeds that your young people have been carrying out during Anti-Bullying Week. It's been fantastic to see the students walking around with their Recognition Card and to witness the Equalities Group assembly. Safety and bullying is an absolute priority for us at Woodside. We have made some systemic changes to support this. A one way system has been introduced to reduce the number of students in the corridor going in different directions and our new duty system on the toilets is in place to ensure that the toilets are supervised so students can go in with privacy. We have also introduced a system of workshops to follow up on incidences of bullying.





Dear Parent/Carer

We know how important it is for you to be able to send your child to school.

As the Winter season approaches, we at Woodside we are taking a number of measures to help prevent the spread of Coronavirus, including:

- Encouraging all staff to test regularly, to minimise the risk of our teachers giving your child or other children Covid;
- Ensuring our staff and children practice good hygiene;
- Making sure our spaces are well ventilated; and;
- Encouraging all members of our community to isolate and book a <u>PCR test</u> should they develop symptoms
 of the virus or receive a positive result on a Lateral Flow Test.

Up to one in three people who have COVID-19 can spread the virus without knowing. This is because they have no symptoms. We are therefore asking all parent/carers to test their children/encourage their children to test every Monday and Thursday, report their results and help us to keep the spread of Covid at Woodside down to a minimum and in turn keeping our young people safe.

This letter has gone out to all parent/carers of children at Woodside asking them to regularly test their children/encourage their children to test and to report each result.

Your child will be able to collect home test kits from the main school gate and bring them home with them fortnightly on a Friday. Please ask your child if they have received these and help them to take the test and report their results. Testing is free of charge and will help us keep the transmission of the virus to a minimum within our community.

Each test pack will come with guidance on how to take the test - tests usually take a few minutes to do and you get the results in 30 minutes. Then all you need to do is to report the result to:

- NHS Test and Trace: https://www.gov.uk/report-covid19-result
- If it is a positive result please book a PCR test at the soonest available time
- Contact attendance@woodsidehighschool.co.uk and confirm your child's absence whilst awaiting a PCR
 test or call the school line on 0208 889 6761 and leave a message on our attendance line option. We will
 require proof of PCR results once they have been received.

As a school we will holding assemblies for all year groups in the next few weeks on the importance of regularly taking and lateral flow tests and recording results as well as the benefits of being vaccinated against Covid.

We appreciate your help with this ongoing process and providing the encouragement your child may need in order to ensure for these tests to be effectively carried out.
