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ATTEND & ACHIEVE... EVERY SCHOOL DAY COUNTS

As we approach the Christmas holidays and begin booking time away, it is important to note that the holiday dates are as follows:

The last day of term is Friday 17th December. Your child is expected to attend.

The holiday runs from Monday 20th December – Friday 31st December. Monday 3rd is a public holiday, Tuesday 4th is a school inset day. Wednesday 4th January, 2022 is the first school day of term and your child is expected to attend school.

We are working with the local authority to address the issue of unauthorised extended holidays as we are aware that it has a negative effect on student achievement as they try to catch up on work that they have missed. To avoid being in contravention of Section 444 of the 1996 Education Act you should:

• keep trips abroad within the school holiday period (this includes planning in any necessary periods of self-isolation)

• request leave (using a leave request form) before booking any travel. You will need to provide supporting evidence. Please note that we do not authorise travel to visit friends or extended family members who are unwell.

- making contact with the school (through our education welfare office) if you are unsure about whether an absence will be authorised. We are always happy to help
- ensure that your child arrives punctually and attends every day unless they are too unwell to be in school. Days off add up quickly.

Did you know that:

- Students should be in school 97% of the time. This is equal to having less than 6 days off during the entire school year.
- For a child's attendance to be considered a concern, they only need to miss 10 days of school within an academic year. For a child to be considered persistently absent, they need to miss 19 school days.
- If you take a holiday that extends into term time, it is likely that your child will fall into this category.

Attendance is a significant determining factor to achievement and GCSE grades. Students with no absences are 2.2 times more likely to achieve 5+ GCSEs A*- C or equivalent.

BEYOND BOUNDARIES

This weekend, the Year 9 Community Theatre Elective will be performing alongside actor and director, Ali Gaderi, to raise money for the Haringey Migrant Centre.

The performance will reveal the true stories of Refugees and Asylum seekers, now living in the UK. It explores a refugee's experience before and after arriving to the UK. Students have used and researched individual accounts through interviews, online research, videos and newspaper articles. The performance is in the style of Verbatim Theatre to portray natural, real, raw accounts of Refugees from Afghanistan, Palestine and Iran. Students have also considered and used the style of Physical Theatre to tell a story through movement, to allow audiences to interpret feeling and tension.

We are very proud of the Community Theatre class for showing dedication to their studies, and rehearsing at Alexandra Palace until 7 p.m. each Wednesday in preparation for the performance.

We look forward to seeing their work make its way from the page to the stage on the 27th of November .

THE AR TREASURE BOX


All students from Year 7-10 can participate in a brand new challenge that we've recently set up in the library - The AR Treasure Box.

BOOK REVIEWS




The girl who speaks bear
