Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope that families are keeping well during this most recent Omnicron outbreak. Please can you continue to support our collective effort by sending your child in with masks and testing at least twice weekly. We are very fortunate that our main building, the Birch block, has automatic windows which open when CO2 levels are too high.

It is hard to believe that it is already week two of the Spring Term. Thank you to our parents and carers who made the Year 11 Parents and Carers' Evening. Period 6 is now compulsory for nearly all students in Year 11 daily to support revision. Two things which can really support your child with online revision is spending 5 hours minimum weekly on MathsWatch and the use of <u>https://senecalearning.com/en-GB/</u>. For students in KS3, they can start their extra work earlier by continuous practice on MathsWatch.

Finally, I wanted to take this time to share with you our focus on standards and calmness in the school environment. We are issuing conduct points to replace the C1-C4 system. If a student makes a minor error they will receive a conduct point and this acts as a warning. However, consistently receiving conduct points will result in detentions. Please remind your child of our core rules, to move around the buildings calmly and speaking to peers and teachers with absolute respect.

As part of this drive, we have launched - Woodside Manners. This is updated weekly, sharing our values in relation to behaviour. This week we have been focusing on our 'Hands Off' policy which emphasises the importance of keeping our hands to ourselves, to teach students about the importance of consent. – Please see our promotions below. We will be rewarding students who adhere to this.
