Dear Parents and Carers,

Woodside High School is committed to high quality teaching and learning for all of our students. As we return from lockdowns and periods of time out of school it is important that we review our systems to ensure that we are fulfilling this commitment.

Today, I have spoken to all students about ensuring that we follow our school values. We expect that:

- Students demonstrate behaviour which reflects credit on themselves and on their parents and carers.
- Students are well-mannered, speak appropriately and with respect to each other and to staff.
- Students wear their uniform correctly, with pride.

We will be revising our consequence system so that students receive Praise Points and Conduct Points. Praise points will continue to be monitored and students praised with contact home, breakfasts with the Headteacher, rewards and badges. Conduct points will be monitored and students will have consequences such as lunchtime detention, reflection room or Saturday morning study sessions.

I will be working closely with colleagues to ensure that the conduct point system is consistently applied so that students can focus on their learning and achieving the very best outcomes.

We would like to invite parents and carers to a meeting to discuss this further and welcome any feedback and suggestions. Thank you for all you do to support your child in their education at Woodside.

CHANGES TO FACE MASK REQUIREMENTS

As of Thursday 20 January, the Department for Education has advised that face masks are no longer recommended in classrooms and teaching spaces for staff and students in vear 7 and above.

From Thursday 27 January, face coverings are no longer recommended in communal areas for staff and students in year 7 and above. The Director of Public Health may advise the use of face coverings in communal areas in individual settings experiencing outbreaks, as a temporary measure.
