A MESSAGE FROM THE MET POLICE - WALK & TALK INITIATIVE

This is an initiative that was launched earlier this week in Haringey as part of their violence against women and girls action plan. This is an important piece of work where we will be inviting women and girls to tell us what they think needs to change and how they feel we can improve safety in Haringey.

The Walk and Talk initiative involves female officers buddying up with women from their communities to go out on patrol in open spaces so that they can hear first-hand their experiences, concerns and reflections. The aim of the walkabout is to start a conversation between the public and officers about their safety concerns and what police can do, working with partners, to address them.


DRAMA REWARD THEATRE

INFORMATION SHARING SESSIONS FOR PARENTS OF CHILDREN WITH SEND IN MAINSTREAM SCHOOLS

Haringey SEND Parent Carer Forum and SENDIASS are holding information sharing sessions for parents of children with SEND in mainstream schools.

Come along and find out about new guidance for mainstream schools regarding meeting the needs of children with SEND, as well as learning about schools' duties and parents' rights.

The daytime and evening sessions will cover the same topics – you only need to book on to one of the sessions.

<u>Daytime session link</u> Evening session link

Ellika McAuley, SEND Adviser from Haringey Council will talk about the new guidance for schools:

- SEND Core Standards an online resource which sets out the expectations for the quality of provision for children with SEND in Mainstream schools
- SEND Support Guide a document for class teachers and SENDCos to use as a quick reference for identifying and effectively meeting the needs of children and young people who are receiving SEND support.

Sarah Miller and Harriet Lewis from SENDIASS will talk about parents' and children's rights in relation to mainstream education

- The requirements of mainstream schools to provide SEN Support to children without an EHC Plan what the SEND Code of Practice says
- The graduated approach, and the 'assess, plan, do, review' cycle, and how parents can engage in this
- The specifics of the law around parents' right to choose mainstream education, and the (limited) exceptions to this right
- What steps parents can take if the legal obligations described above are not being met

Dear Colleagues 10th March 2021

We would like to inform you that – as part of Haringey Council's exciting Holiday Activity and Food (HAF) Programme – children eligible to receive Free School Meals (FSMs) will be able to access several free holiday camps during the Easter school holiday.

We all know the value and benefits of providing enriching activities for our young people. It is an opportunity for them to learn and socialise but also an important source of childcare, and a point of contact for children and families during this holiday period.

To help families access these activities we have again partnered with Evouchers (on the Wonde platform) to generate and distribute HAF vouchers to all families eligible for free school meals, including children eligible for the extended Haringey FSM expansion programme.

We appreciate that school life is busy and do not mean to create extra work, however we ask for your help with distributing these HAF vouchers to all your families registered for FSM, including those identified by the FSM expansion policy. The HAF vouchers will go live on Monday 14th March, please note that spaces are limited therefore we encourage families to book a space asap.

How it works

Option A: Schools currently using Evoucher by Wonde for their free school meal vouchers


The HAF vouchers ordering process is like ordering FSM vouchers through the Wonder Evouchers platform.

- Sign into Evouchers
- Order HAF vouchers through the Evouchers platform
- When selecting the voucher type, please select Haringey HAF Vouchers
- At the checkout, select Haringey HAF Vouchers from the who is paying for this invoice dropdown
- Send vouchers as normal to eligible FSM parents
- HAF vouchers go live on Monday 14th March (ideally would like for all schools to send out HAF vouchers on the same day to make the booking process as fair as possible to families).

Option B: School not registered to Evouchers by Wonde

- The Evouchers team will be in touch shortly to give further instructions to explain how to order HAF vouchers through the Evouchers platform
- HAF voucher will be sent to parent using your MIS data (or upload a .csv file)
- Then parents can book their children directly onto a HAF activity
