JACK PETCHEY SPEAK OUT CHALLENGE FINAL

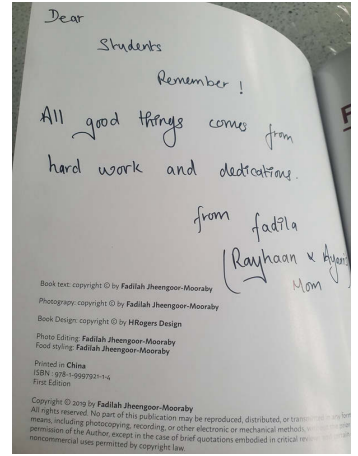
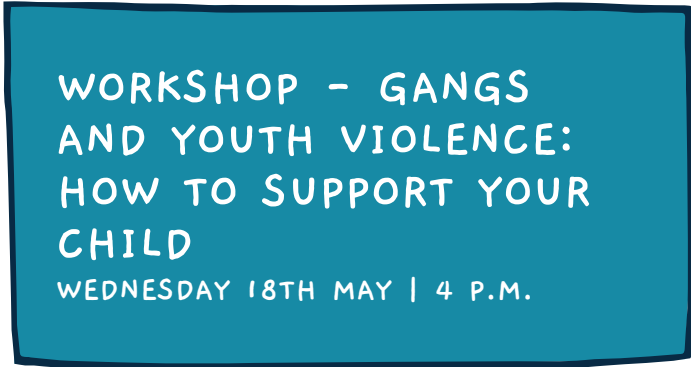
Our very own Alp Yildiz in Year 10 achieved third place in the Haringey Jack Petchey Speak Out Challenge final.
