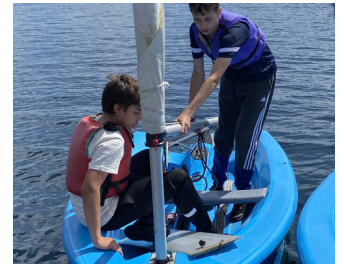
## TRIP TO WEST RESERVOIR CENTRE

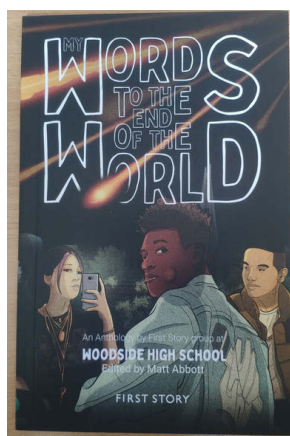
