Please note below our summer events and thank you to all families and students for returning trip preferences so quickly.



This book is a well-paced and perfect for dystopian and romance fans. The plot revolves around a competition between 35 girls and a prince; they must all compete for his love and for the position of a princess. In a dystopian world where your wealth describes your lifestyle and career, a normal caste 5 girl called America Singer is chosen to compete against 34 other girls. America finds trouble coping in the palace, as she's leaving her home and secret love.

I would recommend this audience to girls aged 12-15 (young teen range), since this book does have one or two disturbing topics, but it is family friendly and safe to read for most ages. It is an interesting book and will definitely keep you reading.
