The Haringey Special Educational Needs & Disabilities Information, Advice and Support Service (SENDIASS) is provided by Markfield. SENDIASS is a free, impartial and confidential service for Haringey residents. We offer parents, carers, and children and young people who have (or may have) SEND:

- **Help to navigate** and understand the procedures and services to support children and young people with SEND, aged from 0 to 25 years
- **Advice** about your options to access education, health and social care services
- **Support** to contribute your views to assessments and reviews, fill in forms and prepare for meetings
- **Help** when things go wrong, including support with disagreement resolution and mediation
- **Support** around school exclusions, and with complaints/appeals on SEND-related matters

Training workshops

We provide free online training sessions for parents and carers, including the following topics:

- Understanding the SEND system
- EHC Needs assessments
- School exclusions
- Annual Reviews
- Short Breaks Personal Budgets

Family club

We run a drop-in session at the Markfield centre where parents/carers, children, young people can get advice around SEND issues, as well as meet other families, have a shared lunch and a fun time playing in our huge adventure playground - with a trampoline, zip wire, slides, swings and arts and craft activities.



Family Club happens on the second Saturday of the month in school term times from 11:30am to 2:30pm.

Who we are

The Haringey Special Educational Needs & Disabilities Information, Advice and Support Service (SENDIASS) is provided by Markfield - a local community hub where people can play, socialise and get information and advice.

What we do

SENDIASS is a free, impartial and confidential service for parents, children and young people who are living in Haringey. This includes:

- **Help to navigate** and understand the systems and services for children and young people with special educational needs & disabilities (SEND) aged from 0 to 25 years
- **Advice** about your options to access education, health and social care services
- **Support** to engage with the professionals working with your child at nursery, school or college, to contribute your views to assessments and reviews, and prepare for meetings
- **Help when things go wrong**, including support with accessing disagreement resolution and mediation
- **Support** around school exclusions, and with complaints and appeals on SEND-related matters
- **Signposting** parents and young people to additional support services where needed

Advice surgeries

We provide appointments (either in person, online, or on the phone) for parents of children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND). We can also provide advice directly to young people with SEND.

Advice surgeries are held at the Markfield centre, and schools, children's centres and community venues around Haringey.

We can:

- give you impartial advice about SEND procedures and law
- help you to communicate with your child's school to discuss SEND-related concerns
- advise you of Education Health and Care (EHC) needs assessments, and EHC Plans
- help you review and respond to professional reports
- support you to participate in meetings such as Annual Reviews
- advise about procedures for making complaints and appeals
- give you information about other local SEND-related services
