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Dear Parents and Carers,

Re: National Education Union (NEU) planned strike action

I am writing to update you on the NEU planned strike action which you may have heard of on the news.

The NEU announced its ballot results on Monday 16th January giving notice that there will be a series of national and regional strikes. The strike action affecting London based schools will take place on the following dates:

- Wednesday 1st February (national strike)
- Thursday 2nd March (London regional strike)
- Wednesday 15th March (national strike)
- Thursday 16th March (national strike)

We anticipate that the action by the NEU will have an impact on the normal day to day running of the school but at this stage it is not possible to say the extent of that impact. In principle the school will be open but we will have to make some adjustments to address this. I understand that the potential disruption to your child's education may be frustrating so I will keep you informed on developments as soon as possible.
