RE: Year 8 Progress Tests & Assessment Weeks

At Woodside High School, we see providing a rich, challenging and ambitious curriculum that enables our students to secure great examination results as a key part of our core purpose. In order to achieve this, we must accurately assess our students to identify knowledge gaps and give accurate feedback.

These assessments start with Progress Test later this month followed by 3 key assessment weeks that I have outlined below.

The Progress Test are standardised test that will provide key information about your child's progress and will also:

- Support future curriculum planning
- Indicate potential performance
- Identify any additional support
- Identify any barriers or gaps in knowledge
- Provide and assessment of current knowledge and skills in relation to age-related expectation

Progress Test

- English paper on Monday 19 September (periods 1 and 2)
- Maths paper Tuesday 20 September (periods 1 and 2)

Each test is 1 hour 15 minutes in duration. Please be aware that your child will not need to revise for these tests and we ask you to ensure that your child has their normal equipment on the day.

Exams and Assessment guidance for students

At **Woodside High School** we aim to make your exam/assessment experience as stress-free and successful as possible, there are strict rules which staff and students at Woodside High School are expected to follow.

- You **MUST** arrive on time for your exams/tests. If you are late, you will be marked late, and you may not be able to sit the test.
- You **MUST** bring with you, all of the equipment necessary for the exam (black pen, sharp pencil, ruler, eraser, protractor, compass, highlighters, a calculator). All equipment must be in a clear/see through bag.
- Full School Uniform must be worn.
- **Do not bring mobile phones/MP3 players or watches of any sort to school.** If you do, you **MUST HAND THEM TO AN INVIGILATOR** outside the exam room. You will be given a plastic number card for your possessions, which you must return to the invigilator once you leave the exam. We do not accept responsibility for any loss of these items.
- No food or fizzy drinks allowed in the exam room. If you bring your own water to school, you will be asked to remove the label.
- You **MUST NOT TALK** once you are in the hall.
- You **must** remove all paper and notes/timetables from pockets and place them in your bag and place your bags where directed by an invigilator.
- Where calculators are permitted, calculator cases must be placed on the floor.
- Once seated, you are **NOT** permitted to leave your seat. If you have a question or require any equipment such as a calculator, you **MUST PUT UP YOUR HAND** to attract the attention of an invigilator.
- You are not permitted to leave the exam early.
- The school employs a team of invigilators to conduct exams and to support you during your exams. You are expected to show the same level of respect towards external invigilators as they do school staff.
- Invigilators cannot discuss the exam/test paper with you or explain or read the questions to you.
- Students who are disruptive or behave in an unacceptable way will be removed from the exam room by a member of staff. Where this happens you **WILL** be reported and may be disqualified.
- If you experience difficulties during your exams (e.g. illness, injury and personal problems) please inform the school by telephone **as soon as possible**.

- Unless you have a medical condition, for which you have a letter. you are **NOT** permitted to visit the toilet during the exam. Do so before the exam starts.
- If you have not been entered for an exam for which you think you should, please either speak with your teacher, Head of year or the exams manager located in the main office immediately.
- Misreading an exam timetable **will not** be accepted as an explanation for absence.
- **If there is anything you do not understand - PLEASE ASK.**
