Dear parents and Carers,

As you may be aware the National Education Union has declared continued strike action, which will take place on Wednesday 15th and Thursday 16th March 2023. The strike is happening because of a national dispute between the unions and the government over teacher and support staff pay and it's funding in schools and colleges, and not because of any issues at our school.

As a school we aimed at keeping the site open for as many students as possible, however, the student's safety is our main priority and the staff to student ratio was taken into consideration. We remain committed to providing a safe and secure environment for our students and feel that we would be unable to provide this for the whole school with the staff we have available.

We will open the school for $\underline{\text{Year 11}}$ as normal on this day. They should arrive to school as normal at 8.40am and will be school until 3.10pm. There will be no booster lessons for year 11 on this day.

The school will be closed for years 7-10 and there will be online lessons throughout the day with work set which is in line with their current subject topics. THE THEME: This year, the theme is CONNECTIONS.

Nearly all innovations in science, technology, engineering and maths are built on connections between people; two (or more) heads are better than one, after all!

But as well as exploring the importance and joy in connections between individual scientists, research groups and institutions, you could discover the different ways connections appear across all areas of science.

Evolution, for example, shows us the ways that animals, including humans, as well as well, plants and bacteria are all connected in a family tree stretching back millennia.

The connection between human actions and climate change could be a fantastic topic to explore in our poster competition. Or how about how atoms connect to form chemical bonds which make up everything around us. The human body is another topic that offers a plethora of opportunities to think about connections, e.g. how organs are connected.

Perhaps you could explore the science and technology behind the internet or delve into the ways technology has changed the world by connecting people internationally at the click at a button.





Thank you to all students who participated in the karaoke celebration in the Music Department on Wednesday 8th March 2023. It was a special way to come together and embrace equality!!








