

### PI DAY

Pi Day was founded in 1988 by physicist Larry Shaw. March 14th was selected because the numerical date (3.14), represents the first three digits of pi.

The Ancient Greek mathematician Archimedes is most commonly credited with being the first to accurately calculate the estimated value of pi.

In mathematics, Pi represents the ratio of a circle's circumference to its diameter. Although infinite, Pi is often abbreviated to the first three digits (3.14) or the fraction 22/7, to make calculations and problem solving possible.

At Woodside High School, the day was dedicated to Pi activities. Students listened to the Pi Song during tutor time, learned about some of the history behind Pi and investigated the constant ratio of a circle's circumference to its diameter during Maths lessons.

At lunch time students competed to see who had memorised the most digits of Pi. Those who took part won praise points but the overall winners are as follows:

1 st Place - Rana A 9T - An amazing 66 digits! - wins a £20 Amazon voucher 2 nd Place - Anastazja G 7A - 55 digits. - wins a £10 Amazon voucher 3 rd Place - Mariya G 7Q - 30 digits. - wins a £5 Amazon voucher


