Whenever you revise, you are doing one of three things:



1. Finding and closing gaps in your knowledge.



2. Strengthening fading knowledge in your long term memory.



3. Practising recalling knowledge quickly



Cornell Notes

Students use the left-hand large margin for recall cuesaround 3-4 questions or subheadings related to the topic they are studying.

The main section of the page is the space for bullet notes related to the subheadings or questions.

The bottom section is where a student summarises the key learning points they have revised.

This can be left blank and returned to a few days letter to help revisit key concepts.

Flash Cards

Flashcards are small sheets of paper or card with matching pieces of information on either side.

They are a useful tool for learning facts and allow you to quickly check whether you have remembered something correctly.

Students should keep them concise, simple and not spend more time making them than using them.





This book was amazing, it had my attention from start to finish.

A great chance to meet other Somali families with Autistic children.



This term, we are rewarding our top 2 students every day by rewarding them with a voucher each to skip the queue at lunch time.


This has sparked a friendly rivalry between our top students with others challenging to enjoy this luxury.
