



We saw dinosaurs, giant beetles, giant whale and pre historic birds like the giant eagle." - Luke





#### **Excellence** is never an accident

- 1. Clear revision plan
- 2. Materials
- 3. Proven effective revision strategies
- 4. Focus and concentration
- 5. Support structures

Whenever you revise, you are doing one of three things:



1. Finding and closing gaps in your knowledge.



2. Strengthening fading knowledge in your long term memory.



3. Practising recalling knowledge quickly



#### **Cornell Notes**

Students use the left-hand large margin for recall cuesaround 3-4 questions or subheadings related to the topic they are studying.

The main section of the page is the space for bullet notes related to the subheadings or questions.

The bottom section is where a student summarises the key learning points they have revised.

This can be left blank and returned to a few days letter to help revisit key concepts.

#### **Flash Cards**

Flashcards are small sheets of paper or card with matching pieces of information on either side.

They are a useful tool for learning facts and allow you to quickly check whether you have remembered something correctly.

Students should keep them concise, simple and not spend more time making them than using them.


