Whenever you revise, you are doing one of three things:



1. Finding and closing gaps in your knowledge.



2. Strengthening fading knowledge in your long term memory.



3. Practising recalling knowledge quickly.

Cornell Notes

Students use the left-hand large margin for recall cues—around 3-4 questions or subheadings related to the topic they are studying.

The main section of the page is the space for bullet notes related to the subheadings or questions.

The bottom section is where a student summarises the key learning points they have revised.

This can be left blank and returned to a few days later to help revisit key concepts.

Flash Cards

Flashcards are small sheets of paper or card with matching pieces of information on either side.

They are a useful tool for learning facts and allow you to quickly check whether you have remembered something correctly.

Students should keep them concise, simple and not spend more time making them than using them.

Mulberry Academy Woodside celebrated the Day Of Slavonic Alphabet, Bulgarian Enlightenment and Culture on Wednesday 24th May.

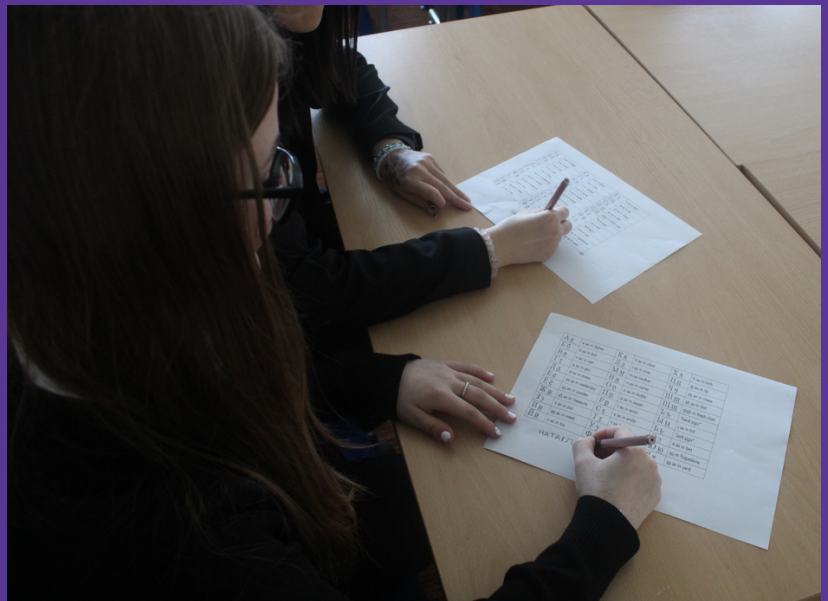

The day became a public holiday in the Republic of Bulgaria in 1990.

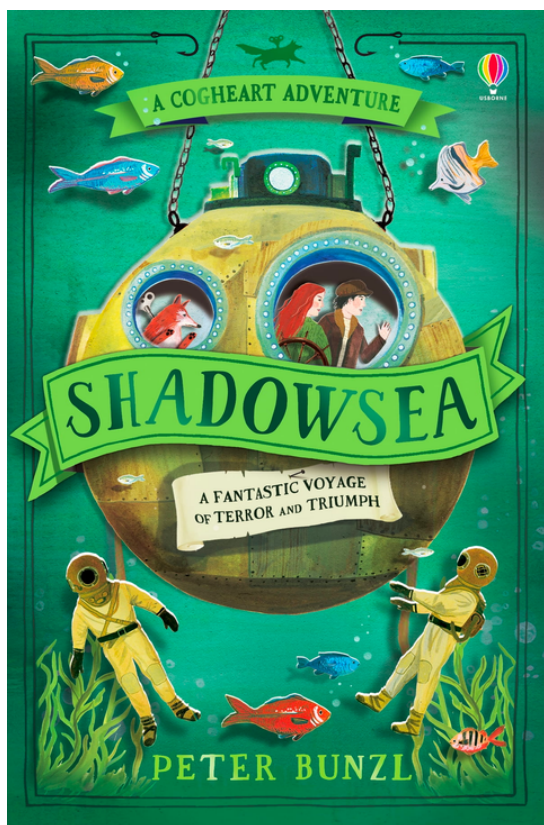
Woodside students engaged in various activities including a form time presentation, a dance workshop as well as a writing workshop.

Shadow Sea Rating ★★★★★

This book is part of the Cogheart book series and is definitely better than the first. It has less overly grim scenes than the first and an antagonist that I found a lot more interesting as a villain. This little adventure has part of it take place underwater so that was also nice to see. I'm just trying to convince you to read the book after you have read Cogheart since it's a good continuation and one of the best book sequels I've read so far. £2000 earning Compound Interest at 5% per year for 3 years

Original Amount = 100%

Compound Interest = 5%

$100\% + 5\% = 105\% \text{ € } 1.05$

$£2000 \times 1.05 \times 1.05 \times 1.05 = £2315.25$

$£2000 \times 1.05^3 = £2315.25$
