DEAR PARENTS AND CARERS,

Welcome to the final half term of this Academic year. It promises to be a busy one with lots to look forward to. This week, our Year 11 students continue with their examinations with another ten days of exams ahead. This will be shortly followed by Year 10 mocks. To prepare our Year 10 students we will be holding walking talking mocks, supervised and supported by their teachers, these are great for students to understand what they need to do in the exam itself.

Students in Year 7 and 8 had some really engaging sessions from Diversity Role Models, a charity which invites LGBT+ or ally role models to speak openly about their lived experiences. This is part of the activities taking place as we celebrate Pride Month.

A group of Year 9 students have begun the first of a six week course at Jamie's farm, a therapeutic learning space where students learn practical skills for working with animas. For all other students there is an opportunity to attend a school trip.

Alongside this we have Sports Day, Work Experience Week and Electives Evening on Wednesday 28th June, please keep this date in your diary if you are a parent of our Year 8 cohort as it offers you a glimpse of what electives are available and the work Year 9 students have done this year.

Changes to site at Woodside site

You may have noticed some building work at Woodside, this is the start of a new canteen build. We will be extending our canteen so students can sit down during meal times and to create another large open working space. We are hoping to create a more family like dining space. Work should be complete sometime in the Autumn term.



Dear Parents and Carers,

As a part of your child's education at Mulberry Academy Woodside, we promote personal wellbeing and development through a comprehensive Personal, Social, Health and Economic (PSHE) education programme. PSHE education is the curriculum subject that gives young people the knowledge, understanding, attitudes and practical skills to live safe, healthy, productive lives and meet their full potential.

This half term your child will be taking part in lessons which focus on the relationships and sex education (RSE) aspect of this programme. RSE lessons will include teaching about:

- healthy relationships, including friendships and intimate relationships
- families
- growing and changing including puberty
- personal hygiene
- changing feelings
- becoming more independent
- keeping safe and consent
- developing self-esteem and confidence.

The RSE curriculum will be delivered age appropriately. Students will also have opportunities to ask questions that help prepare them for relationships of all kinds in the modern world.

PSHE education is taught throughout the school in every year group and is monitored and reviewed regularly by the staff and governing body. Please visit the school's website: https://www.mulberrywoodside.org/ for more details about our PSHE curriculum. All PSHE teaching will take place in a safe learning environment and is underpinned by our school ethos and values of kindness, respect and pride.

We encourage you to discuss these areas with your child before, during or after our topic as children say they greatly value being able to talk to their parents/carers about these issues.
















Salah: The Playground To The Pitch

LATENESS TO SCHOOL FOR PUPILS -UPDATED PROCESS TO START FROM MONDAY 12TH JUNE

If you arrive at school after 8.40am you are late.

- 1) Sign in at the canteen entrance. (If you arrive after 9.10am you will sign in at the main reception and wait for student support to take you to your lesson. If this happens twice in one week your parents will be contacted for a meeting).
