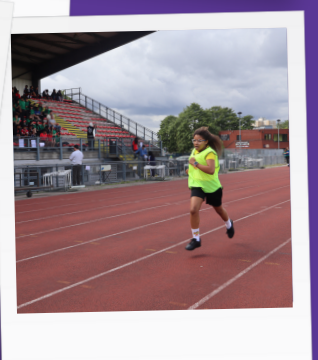

HOOPS Project

HOOPS is a basketball project initiated by officers from U34 at 3 area TSG. It is designed as a fun way for students to interact with officers from TSG, to overcome common misconceptions about the TSG, put a human face on the police and answer any questions that the students may have regarding the TSG and policing in general.



The basic premise is that it's a 4-week project and officers attend PE lessons on a weekly basis at the school. We play basketball with the class and then have a conversational session about various topics including stop and search, & knife crime, keeping safe etc.

We have run 3 out of the 4 sessions with the last one running on Monday 17th July.



Week 1 was an introduction to us, what we do and why we do it. We covered the reasons that the TSG have been posted to Haringey and Enfield and spoke about the students own experiences with the police.

Week 2 was an opportunity for the students to see the kit and equipment we routinely use including door entry equipment, suits for working in hazardous environments and public order kit. We then set up a mock public order scenario with some of the students playing the role of police officers and the rest were a hostile crowd.

Week 3 was the Stop and Search input which I feel is a particularly important one for the students. The TSG are the Mets lead on Stop and Search and we conduct searches on a daily basis as part of our core responsibilities to reduce knife crime and gang related violence. The student group we are engaging with at the moment are at the most vulnerable age for either being coerced into gang activity or falling victim to gang crime.

The Stop search input provides them with the information they need should they ever see Police engaging in searches or be searched themselves. Yesterdays session involved the Students taking up the role of Police officers and running Stop searches on each other.

The last session next week will include some Basic first Aid techniques and advice and an input on online safety.

English Reward Trip

On July 11th and 12th Mulberry Academy Woodside's English department hosted two reward trips for Mr Boniface's Year 8 and Year 9 English classes, who have made great progress this year.

Students got to explore famous sites in the capital including Buckingham Palace, Big Ben and Westminster Abbey - before taking the Uber Boat from Westminster Pier to Greenwich.

The students enjoyed visiting the sites and behaved tremendously well during the trip.
