THE HOUSE SYSTEM

Each student who joins us at Mulberry Academy Woodside will be allocated a House (^^^). The House system encourages a sense of identity and pride in our school community; provides leadership opportunities and ensures collaboration and support across year groups. House competitions take place regularly throughout the year including interform football, sports day, photography competitions, PE poetry competitions, chess competitions, ake off, Debate and Woodside House has talent, Sports Day.

WOODSIDE PASSPORT

This is something which each student in Woodside will complete by the time they finish with us at Woodside. This is a series of opportunities and experiences that all students will undertake to build confidence and ensure our young people can compete in a globally competitive world and emerge as agents of social change. This includes trips, performances, writing and having published their own creative work, engaging in debates and sports.

PUNCTUALITY

Being on time matters. Arriving late to school can disrupt learning for both the student who is late themselves and to other students in the class

If you arrive to school after 8.40am you are late.



- 1. Sign in at the canteen entrance. (If you arrive after 9.10am you will sign in at the main reception and wait for student support to take you to your lesson if this happens twice in one week your parents will be contacted for a meeting) automatic SLT detention.
- 2. Attendance team will stamp your journal and communicate to home
- 3. Go to tutor time for the remainder of the lesson
- 4. Attend ${\bf C004}$ to complete your late form at lunch time $% {\bf C004}$ and then go to lunch
- 5. If you fail to complete your late form you will have an SLT detention
- 6. If you fail to attend your SLT detention you will then be in the **Reflection Room** the following day
- 7. If you are late 3 or more times in a week it is an automatic SLT detention.
- 8. Your punctuality is monitored and tracked by the attendance and year team

SCHOOL UNIFORM AND BUYING SCHOOL UNIFORM

MULBERRY ACADEMY WOODSIDE UNIFORM POLICY

At Mulberry Academy Woodside we wear our uniform with pride and recognise the importance of looking smart at all times.

School Uniform

- Plain white long or short sleeve shirt
- Black Blazer with embroidered badge on pocket
- Plain black straight cut, medium width trousers / a plain 'A' shaped knee length black skirt
- Plain black trousers
- Black socks or white socks / Plain black tights
- Plain black flat leather shoes with no markings (No trainers, plimsolls or boots)
- Plain black v-necked jumper (no round-necked jumpers or sweatshirts)

School PE Kit

PE Kit: green sweatshirt with logo, green polo shirt with logo, black tracksuit bottoms or shorts and trainers, which may only be worn during PE. Please ensure that all items are named.

Dress Code

- Shirts should be tucked in and top buttons should be fastened at all times
- Ties should show at least 9 silver or blue stripes
- Blazers must be worn at all times
- Trousers must not be worn below the waist
- Trainers will not be allowed inside the buildings, but may be worn on the astroturf or during PE.
- Skirts should be "A" line and knee length
- Long white/black socks or black tights
- Hair accessories and head scarves should be black or white
- Earrings are limited to studs and no other jewellery is permitted
- Hairstyles must be sensible no shaved patterns, tramlines or slits in eyebrows. Only natural hair colours allowed
- Nail varnish and false nails should not be worn
- Hoodies are not allowed in school and will be confiscated if seen by staff
- Students must be clean-shaven
- No Balaclavas

EQUIPMENT

Students should bring

- Black pen(s)
- Green pen
- Pencil
- Ruler
- Pencil case
- Rubber and sharpener
- Calculator
- PE kits on PE day
- Students should always carry a reading book- (these can be borrowed from the school library)

MOBILE PHONES

Mobile phones or other electronic equipment are not to be used in school. If mobile phones are seen in school, they will be confiscated immediately and only returned when parents/carers collect them. If students need to make a phone call at the end of the day they can do so from the school phone in the student reception.

Mobile phones are not to be seen or heard in the school day. If a students has a phone out, the Academy reserves the right to confiscate mobile phones for up to ten days.

SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL

Mulberry Academy Woodside is on a main road which is well lit throughout the year. After school and before school, Senior leaders and head of years are out on patrol welcoming in all students and checking they get home safely. Our safer schools policeman is also on duty to keep everyone safe. There is a pedestrian crossing outside school so students can cross safely. We ask all students to go home immediately after school rather than visit local shops and parks for their safety and respect for the local community.



STUDENT JOURNALS

Students are issued with a journal every term. It is good to get into the habit of recording homework and tasks. The journal is the most obvious place to communicate between home and school. Please check this at weekly.

THE CURRICULUM

At Woodside, we aim to create a personalised curriculum that promotes a love of learning; provides breadth of knowledge and skills; that is enriching and supportive and seeks to bridge the cultural knowledge gap in order to provide a platform for our students to succeed in whatever they aspire to do.

Students in KS3 study the following: English, Maths, Science, PE, Music, Art, Drama, DT, History, Geography, RE/RSE, PSE, French, and Spanish

In Year 9, alongside the core curriculum, students are encouraged to follow the Elective Curriculum. The Elective Curriculum provides a wide range of stimulating courses that allow students to have a deep learning experience that will prepare them well for future GCSE studies.- see website for further information.

At Woodside, we understand the importance of our students' views and opinions and provide an opportunity for discussion on important issues through Year Councils and the School Council. Council members are elected by their peers in elections conducted in September of each year.

Each class elects democratically two representatives to serve on the Year Council. The role of the class representatives is to consult with their peers over issues that arise at Year Council Meetings and report back to their class at the earliest opportunity. Each class also elects two deputy class representatives, in case of absence.

At the first meeting of each Year Council, students elect a chairperson and secretary. Minutes of the meetings are taken and are available to all representatives in the following weeks meeting. The aim of this is to ensure that every student can be kept informed and to generate further interest in issues discussed. Minutes are usually posted on the year notice board by the Head of Year.

INCLUSION AND LEARNING SUPPORT

At Woodside, we value our students overall wellbeing – both physical and emotional wellbeing as highly as we view their Academic performance.

We have a strong pastoral support team including a Wellbeing Manager, 2 counsellors, Health and Emotional Wellbeing (HEWS) clinician, 3 learning mentors, and a Speech and Language Therapist as well as an onsite social worker and community police officer. We also have onsite alternative provision called the Laurel which provides behaviour support.

Everyone in the Inclusion team is committed to the overall wellbeing of our young people. This includes emotional resilience support, behaviour support, and social and communication support. All of which to enables all our students to enjoy school life, feeling happy and secure throughout the school day, meaning everyone is ready to learn and engage fully in our Woodside community. Alongside our strong ethos for good mental health to support learning, we recognise and support students with additional educational needs. Our learning support team lead by the Special Educational Support Coordinator (SENCO) provides support in lessons, Literacy support classes and EAL support with experienced teaching assistants. Punctuality procedures

• Please call before 8:30 a.m. to inform the attendance team of your child's lateness

School actions for attendance:

- 1. Your attendance is monitored and tracked daily
- 2. Texts and phone calls home daily for lateness and absence
- 3.2 consecutive days of missed school results in a home visit (welfare check) by the school
- 4.3 consecutive days of unauthorised absence results in both parents being fined by the Local Authority (Haringey)
- 5. Letters sent home updating parents/carers every HT with pupils attendance
- 1. Those with 100% attendance will go into a raffle at the end of term for prizes such as Amazon vouchers
- 2. Rewards every half term such as trips for 100% and most improved attendance
- 3. Regular certificates and awards
