Pear 8 Football Team Draw in thriller against St Thomas More

The Year 8 boys' football match between Woodside and St Thomas More was an exciting encounter, filled with skillful plays and noteworthy moments. After a brief warm-up, both teams showcased attractive football in the opening 5 minutes, with Woodside taking the lead through a splendid half volley from Esaie, finding the top corner.

Woodside continued to press forward, securing another goal that unfortunately was disallowed for offside. The first half unfolded with both sides displaying a commitment to playing on the ground and breaking through defensive lines. St Thomas More managed to equalise, and the teams entered halftime with a 1-1 scoreline.



In the second half, Woodside made some changes but maintained their impressive form. Eron's brilliant, beating several players led to a second goal, putting Woodside ahead 2-1. Shortly afterward a through ball from Angelos resulted in a penalty after Esaie was taken out by the goalkeeper.
