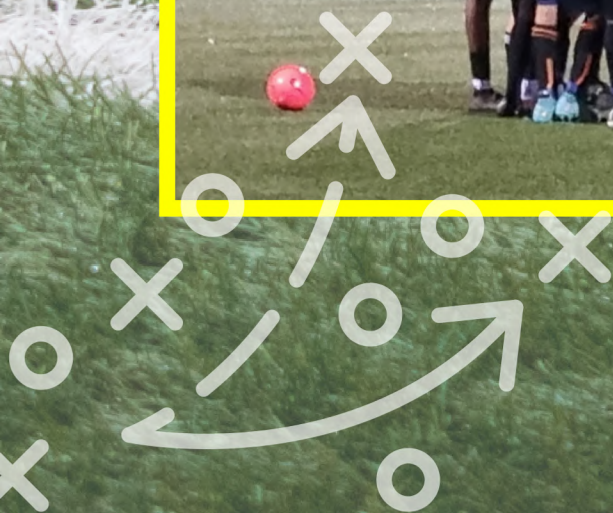
The students enjoyed a delicious Christmas lunch. The day was all about togetherness, laughter, and embracing the festive magic.

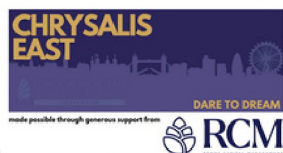

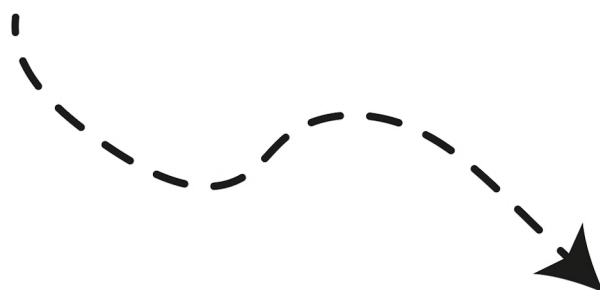

Y8 STEAM Mash-Up Event

In November we ran a STEAM 'Mash-Up' day for 100 Y8 students at Gladesmore. These days involve interactive and creative sessions fusing science and maths with creative subjects.

These half days are part of our year 8 Chrysalis East offer and provide a chance to stretch and challenge all students.

Drama x Chem



Students looked at different types of chemical bonds and then showed their understanding by acting them out using friendships scenarios



English x Physics



Students received a lesson about the history of science and then created superhero characters with science related superpowers



Art x Maths



Students looked at Fractals in maths and used these to create their own algorithmic art

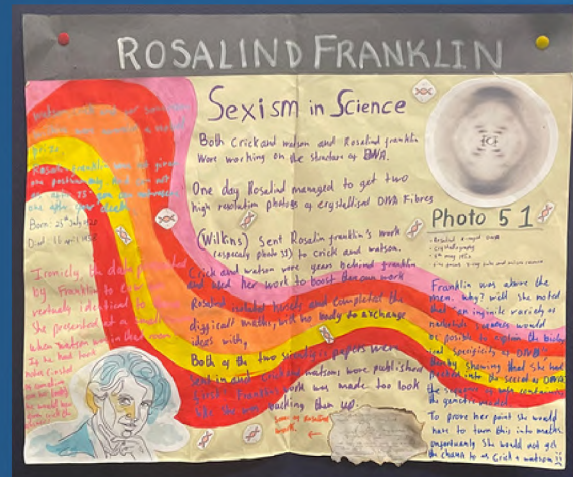


History of Science Lectures

History of Science is now in its 3rd year and was the biggest year so far.

Each week Dr Palfreyman takes the students on a (mostly!) chronological journey through the people, experiments, places and battles that have developed our understanding of what the universe is, what it is made of, how it all works and in particular: what exactly is light?

Filled with interactive quizzes and demonstrations, the lectures are inspired by the Royal Institution's Christmas lectures and this year featured a special guest, who many could be forgiven for thinking was the real Albert Einstein!

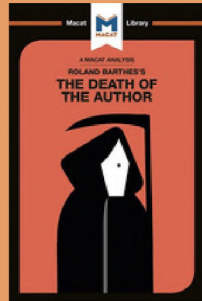

On Friday 8th Dec LAET hosted Haringey Education Partnership's Racial Equity Conference 2023. It was attended by 180 delegates representing around 75% of HEP's membership.

A Chrysalis East English project was the subject of one of the workshops on offer:

Critical and Creative Enrichment in English: an approach to decolonising in an exam-driven climate

How might English teachers curate spaces for critical and creative approaches to their subject despite and beyond the curriculum? In this workshop, we draw on the pedagogy of bell hooks (1994) to explore how critical, creative and community-driven approaches to reading and writing can form a meaningful approach to 'decolonising English' within an exam-driven climate. We will consider three examples of practice the workshop leaders are currently developing, and participants will be invited to share, plan and dream in relation to their own practice.

The workshop leaders all teach in Tottenham schools and are collaborating on their practice through Chrysalis East:

Amina Ali - English Teacher at LAET, formerly Duke's
Josie Carter - KS4 English Lead at Gladesmore Community School
Dr Camilla Stanger - Partnership Teacher of English at Chrysalis East

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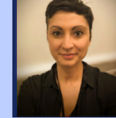
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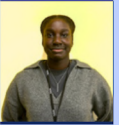
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
