VITAL INFORMATION

This course is an opportunity for students to explore the world around them through the writing of others. The texts we study span several centuries, from the 1600s to the present day. By studying a wealth of literature, students will develop their understanding of what it means to be human - our shared experiences but also our differences. This course is a separate qualification to GCSE English Language; however, it develops many of the same analytical writing skills.

CURRICULUM CONTENT

Paper 1: Shakespeare and the 19th Century Novel

Section A - Macbeth (30 marks + 4 SPAG marks)

Students will study Shakespeare's gruesome tale of murder and deception in order to develop both their understanding of Shakespeare's writing and also the world in which he was presenting his ideas and how they may link to the modern day.

Section B - A Christmas Carol (30 marks)

This text may initially seem like a simple Christmas story; however, students will soon be intrigued to learn about Dickens' determination to transform Victorian society by addressing serious issues such as poverty, greed and isolation.

Paper 2: Modern Texts and Poetry

Section A - An Inspector Calls (30 marks + 4 SPaG marks)

Students start Year 10 studying JB Priestley's ghostly detective play about a wealthy family who have more to do with the sudden death of a young woman than they'd like to admit.

Section B - Anthology Poetry (30 marks)

Students will study a cluster of 15 poems which are linked by themes relating to the human experience.

Section C - Unseen Poetry (32 marks)

This element of the course allows students to explore a range of poems that they have not seen before and analyse themes, ideas and writer's methods.
