

On Tuesday afternoons, these students have been participating in activities that focus on exploratory thought and articulation, and developing an understanding of the debate format. After competing in the opening round, displaying and honing their skills, students will have the opportunity to showcase their refined skills during live, in-person debates at Mulberry Academy Woodside for round two. With seven schools attending, there will be a stirring and spirited atmosphere for students to unveil their intellect and scrutinise their opponents!



BOROUGH ATHLETICS COMPETION

Mulberry Academy Woodside's PE department is celebrating a remarkable triumph at the Borough Athletics competition, with a plethora of outstanding performances across various events.

In the boys' category, Dan and Arron exhibited sheer excellence, clinching victories in the year 9 and 10 60m hurdles, respectively. Adding to the glory, Cyrus secured the third position in the year 10 60m dash. Shaddai demonstrated remarkable speed, securing second place in the year 10 boys' 200m race, while Mitchell displayed grit and determination, earning a commendable fourth place in the year 8 800m event.

Meanwhile, the girls' contingent showcased exceptional talent and determination. Destiny dashed to victory in the year 8 60m race, while Kayla and Kyia delivered notable performances in the 60m hurdles. Jenae displayed her sprinting prowess, claiming the first position in the year 10 60m sprint. Success and Kiara exhibited their speed and endurance, securing second and third places respectively in the year 8 and 9 girls' 200m race.

Not to be outdone, Lobiko and Ciandrew dominated the field in the year 8 and 10 shot put events, showcasing remarkable strength and technique. Furthermore, Aiman showcased versatility, securing second place in the year 8 hurdles and high jump. Additionally, Danny exhibited skill and precision, securing the third position in the year 8 shot put.

In the field events, Efe soared to second place in the year 10 long jump, while in the high jump events, the year 8 girls' team secured third place, and Destiny claimed third in the year 9 girls' high jump.

In the Borough Basketball competition, both the year 8 and year 10 teams from Mulberry Academy Woodside (MAW) showcased their skills and determination!

The year 8 squad really stepped up their game as they progressed through the competition. They learned fast breaks and applied intense pressure on their opponents, causing them to make mistakes. Despite their initial struggles, they improved steedily, finishing 6th in the borough.

Meanwhile, the year 10 team faced some formidable opponents who were physically and technically impressive. Every game was a nail-biter, with each team member giving their all. In a thrilling showdown against Fortismere, MAW traded fast break points, but Fortismere ultimately clinched a narrow victory.

However, MAW wasn't about to let that setback dampen their spirits. In their final match against the unbeaten favorities, Alexandra Park School, they unleashed their pent-up aggression. With lightning-fast fast breaks and aggressive drives to the basket, MAW sturned everyone by racing to a commanding 6-point lead. They maintained their momentum until the final buzzer, triumphing over the eventual champions with an impressive socretine of 11-31

This remarkable victory was achieved by the outstanding teamwork of Aiden, Azeez, Haydar, Efe, Tyler, Luciano, and Umut

Later in the week, the Year 9/10 Basketball team continued their undefeated start to the season winning 39-18 against a strong St Thomas Moore team.

After a slow first quarter in which MAW held a slender lead thanks to the excellent shooting of Azeez. After some tactical changes the team went on to dominate the game with MAW playing as close to perfect basketball as you will see. The team defended superbly with a high number of turnovers and big defensive rebounds.

On offense they were excellent, in particular Tyler Morgan and Aiden Goulevent scoring a high number of baskets. This was well supported by the ball handling skills of Salih and Efe Ozturk who registered a high number of important assists.

Such was the strength of the performance the starting 5 set out the entire 4th quarter which allowed Danny, Luciano, Timothy, Haider and Umut to showcase their talents and get valuable minutes on the court. These 5 manage the final quarter well and help enable MWA to an excellent victory against one of the pre tournament favourities.
