The poster will be judged by a panel of judges in School.

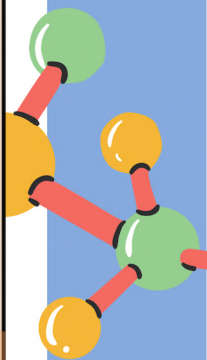

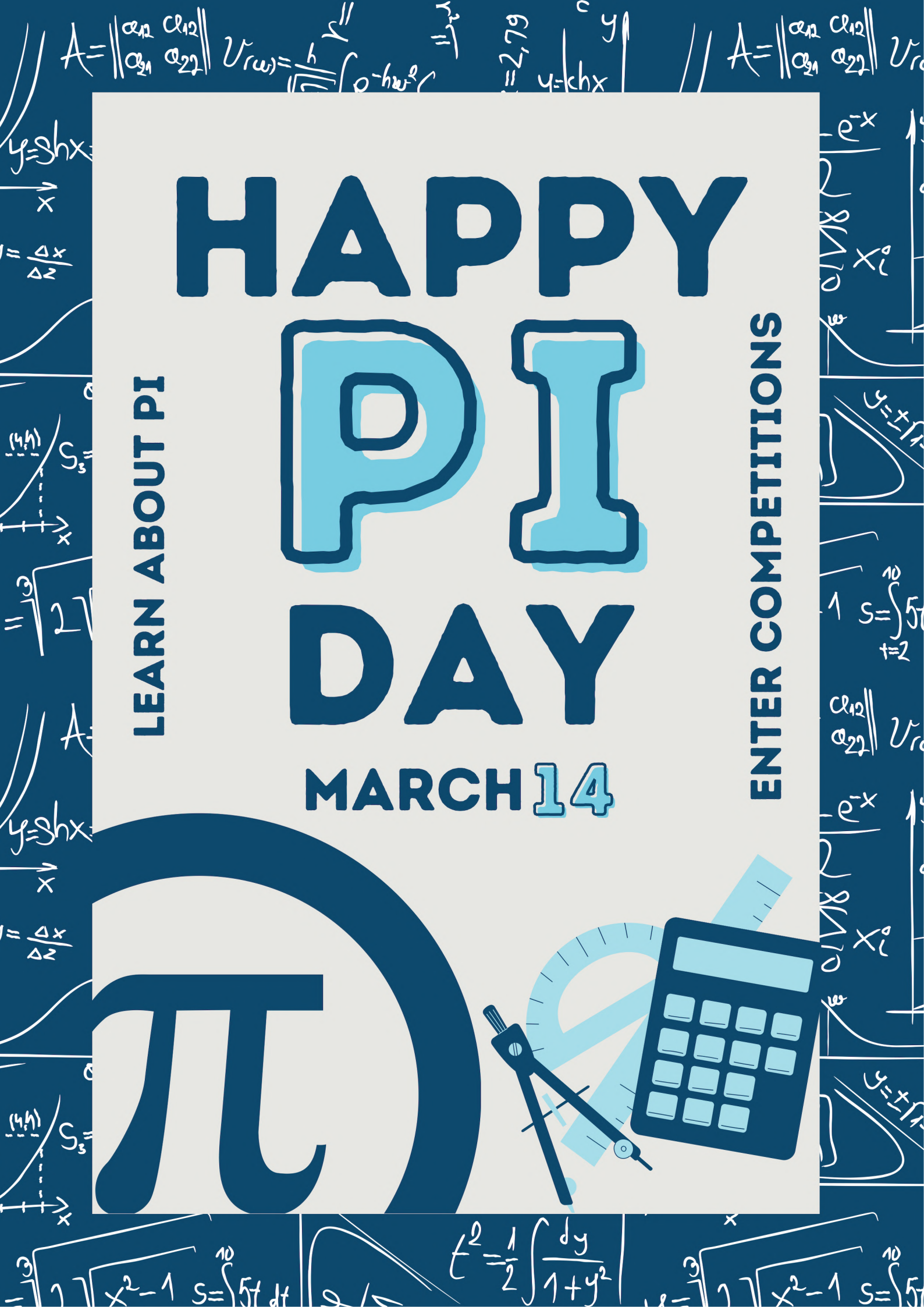
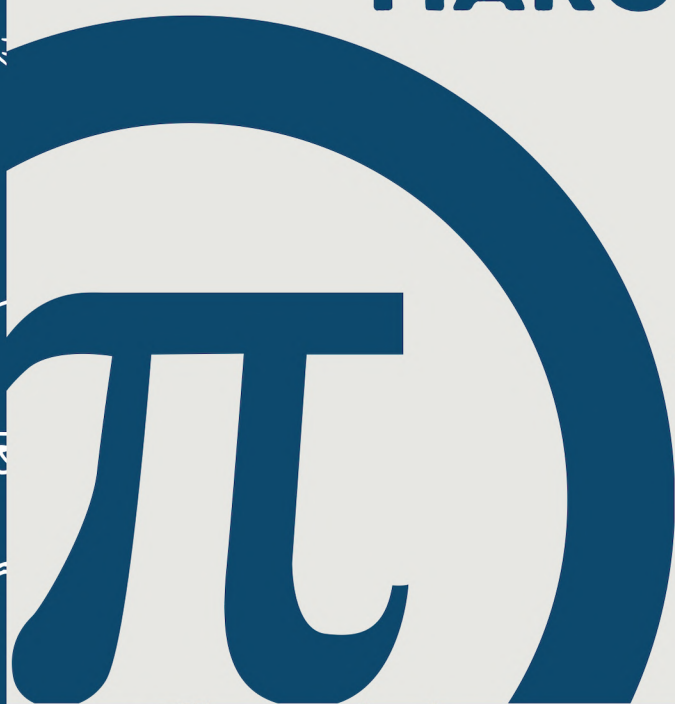
