MET Police TSG Workshop

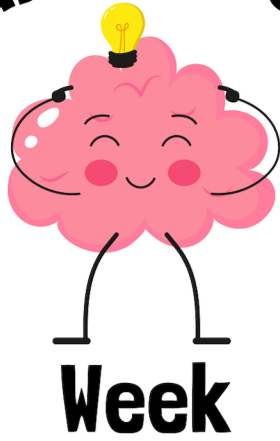

Neurodiversity



This week was neurodiversity week at Mulberry academy Woodside, as part of this event we held a craft event in the Oak room at lunch time giving the student the opportunity and items to make sensory bottles.

If you want to try this at home you will need a 500ml (or bigger) plastic bottle with lid, cooking oil, food colouring, glitter and other crafty items of your choice.

Here's how: fill the bottle with cold water, add 2 tablespoons of cooking oil. Add a few drops of food colouring. You want it to be not too dark so you can see through the bottle for the sensory effect. You can then add gems etc to the mixture. replace the lid and shake the bottle and watch it go crazy and then resettle. Once complete and you are happy get an adult to help you seal the lid with a hot glue gun.

We also had two ex students, Dilan and Chadrach, visit Woodside to give an inspirational talk to a group of our students about the support they recieved at school and their current careers path. Some students also went over to Riverside to join in with some activities as part of the neurodiversity celebration week.



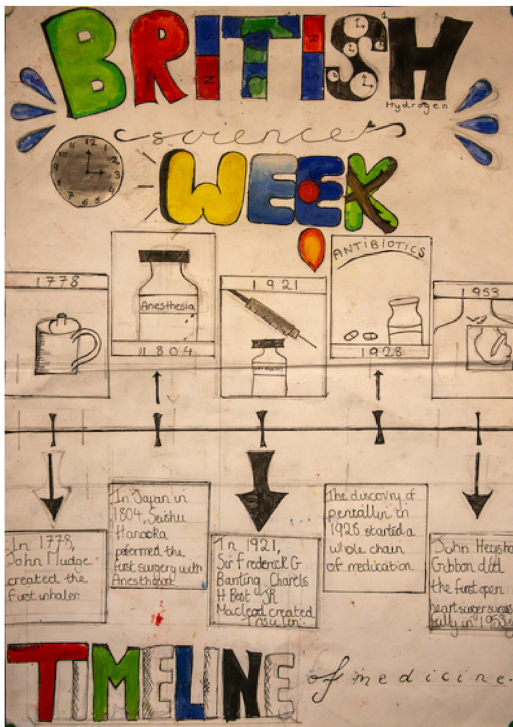
THEATRE TRIP

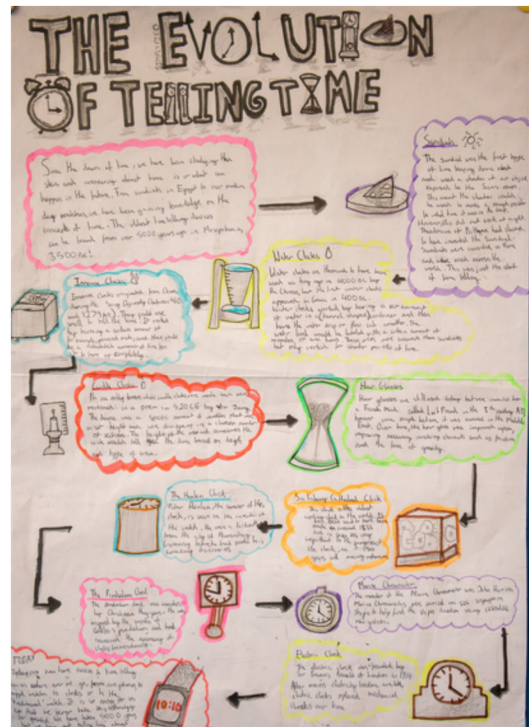


BRITISH SCIENCE WEEK POSTER WINNERS


