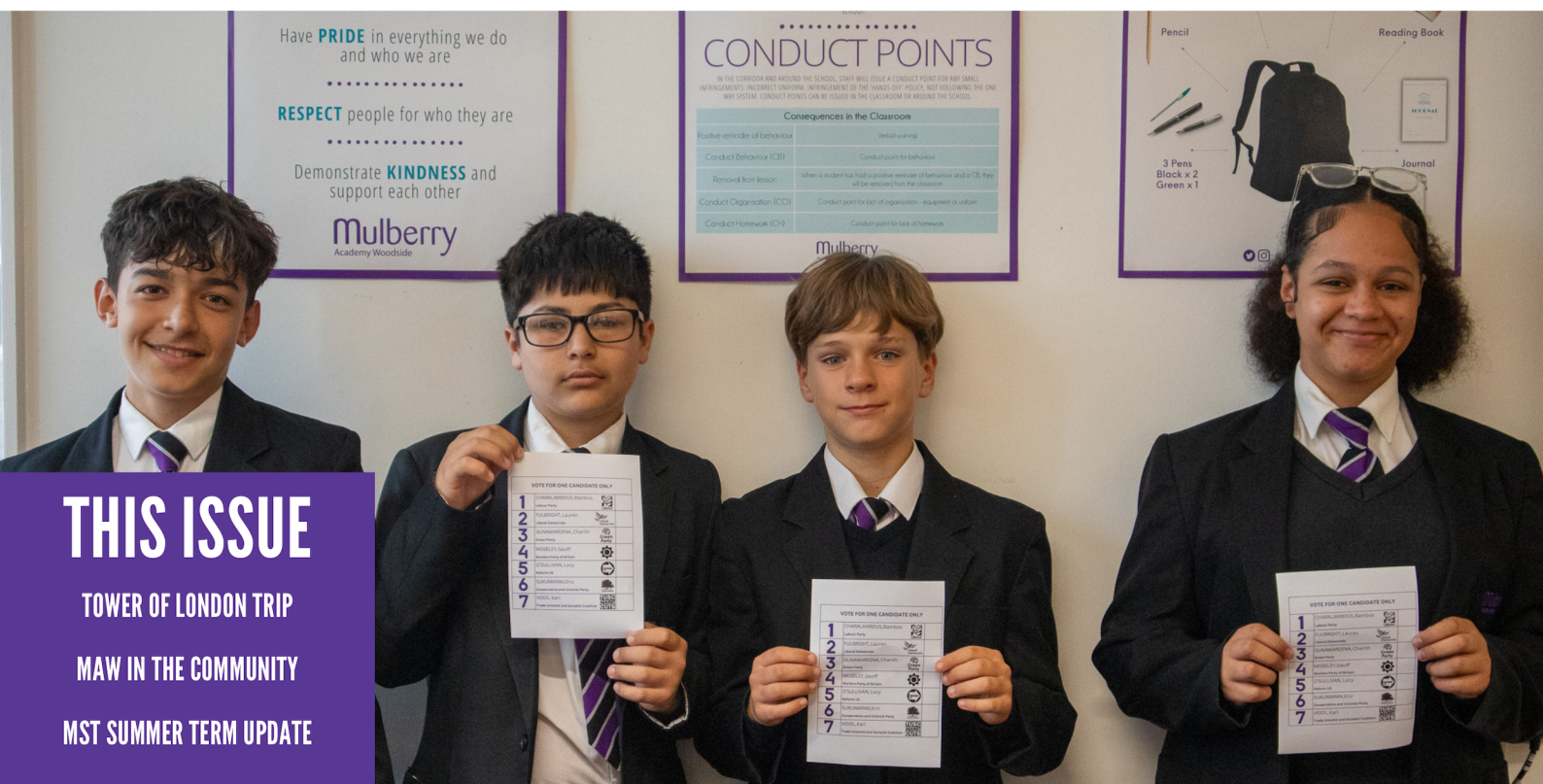

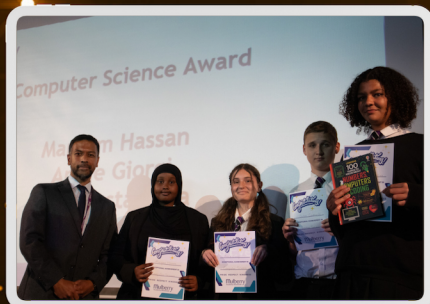

It's packed with sensors (and character) and it can learn to walk, dance, speak and recognise faces and objects.



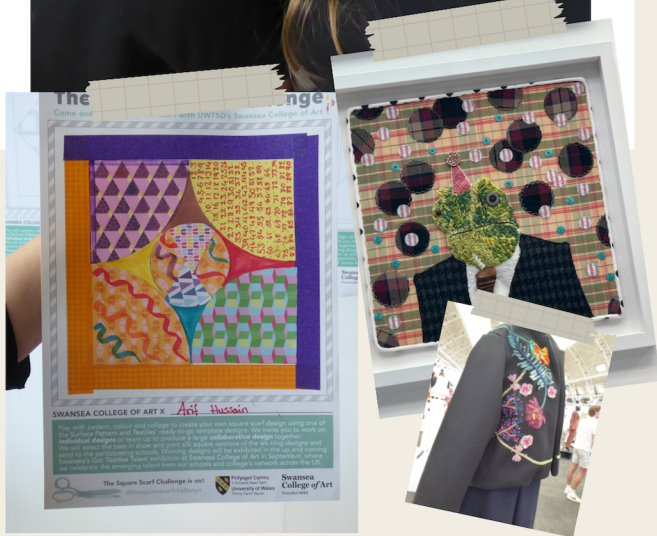


# NEWS DESIGNERS 2024 EXHIBITION

On Thursday 27th June, thirteen year 10, one year 9 and two year 8 students visited the 'New Designers 2024' exhibition at the Business Design Centre in Islington. The exhibition is an annual event, showcasing the work of university graduates from across the country.

Our students were able to see and feel innovative designs created by the new graduates as well as asking questions about their work and career paths and taking part in a seminar on the circular economy. The students also took part in 'The Square Scarf Challenge' run by Swansea University, with year 10 student Arif Hussain's design chosen from the group's entries. Arif's design will be made into a printed silk square version with his design exhibited in the up-and-coming 'Swansea's Got Textiles Talent' exhibition at Swansea College of Art in September.

Year 10 student Reuben Evans-Parsons commented: "I was blown away by the level of beauty present in each of the different forms of design. I will be using a lot of what I viewed to inspire my own design journey!" Whilst fellow year 10 student Selin Kahvecioglu said "It was refreshing to see young people such as myself produce such creative work. Some of what I saw was really clever and very aesthetic".





# YEAR 7 TOWER OF LONDON TRIP

On 4th July, a group of our Year 7 students visited the Tower of London, a grand castle whose first structures were built in 1066 to help William secure his position against the opposing Saxons.

Here they explored the multiple uses of the Tower throughout time, from fortress, to palace, to prison. As part of their visit, their workshop also allowed them to uncover the various instances of treason and stories of Elizabethan prisoners, rich and poor, that still haunt the Tower.





# YEAR TRIP TO WELLCOME COLLECTION



As part of Science and PSHE enrichment, Year 10s visited the Wellcome Collection, in London, to attend a HIV and AIDS Study day workshop.

The students participated in discussion about different aspects of how the virus is spread, its prevention, and also designed posters to raise awareness about the stigma around the infection and people suffering from it.

### Summer Term update:

We have raced F24 and F24+ at Goodwood, Lotus Hethel and Ford Dunton. This has been both sixth form teams and Year 10. This included Mulberry Academy Woodside, who raced for the first time, supported by Manraj Bisran from Mulberry Stepney Green and Steven Farmer from Mulberry Academy Shoreditch on the day. It is a major achievement that they built the car in a few weeks- and achieved 5th place in their first race of 22 teams. It was also great that one of the parents is a mechanic and is heavily involved in the STEM Academy. We hope to get into the finals for the F24 and F24+ in October!



We have built the primary school version of Greenpower- called Goblin - and raced this at Ford Dunton a week ago. Children from year 5 at Mulberry Canon Barnett built the car taught by Mr Talha Bakhtiar from Mulberry School for Girls. The race was attended by a large group of parents who travelled to see the race. It was an excellent day. We didn't win but came close. The children from Canon Barnett have graduated this week - as they have completed CREST superstar awards, robotics, and the Goblin Greenpower race. It will be a lovely event similar to our older students graduation. Children collected certificates, badges, notebook and 5 PRIDE winners received a Mercedes F1 lego car.



We have also had several events with Mercedes- two groups of 12 went on work experience for a week- having an incredible time and meeting Toto Wolff, James Allison and working in various departments in the factory on rotation. We held a careers conference with Mercedes employees who did a presentation followed by a question and answer session. This event was attended by all 200 students in the STEM Academy and was hosted at Mulberry School for Girls.



We took 42 year 10 students to Queen Mary University of London Engineering department – for their event ‘Proud to be an Engineer’. Students were introduced to industry professionals and had hands-on experience of exploring different disciplines of engineering, including Aerospace, Aerodynamic, Mechanical, Chemical and Civil. Students learnt about how light and space lasers can be used to send sound from Earth to Space. Students had a great time learning about aerodynamic and aerospace engineering.



All Year 12 students have spent the day at University of Bath Engineering department, organised and led by Lauren Gilliot at Mulberry Academy Shoreditch.





Next week we have an Alumni event. Queen Mary, University of London (QMUL) careers service -Pasha Selopal Career Consultant, School of Engineering and Material Sciences & School of Physical and Chemical Sciences. Graduate Engineering Engagement Programme (GEEP) – Simona Fornarino, Programme Manager, Diversity & Inclusion will be presenting. 79 students have been invited to attend. Mohammed Ishraq Choudhury, ex year 13 at Mulberry Stepney Green and now doing a degree apprenticeship with Ford in Mechanical Engineering is now mentoring some of our students and will be doing a round of assemblies at our schools to talk about degree apprenticeships. Ishraq has supported others in the STEM Academy at races, and with applications. We have a Year 13 student who is also holding an offer for the same role at Ford, and another one with a mechanical engineering degree apprenticeship offer with Amazon. One of the really great events this term has been the PRIDE award winners trip to Mercedes. 11 students who were previous winners of the PRIDE award – Passion, respect, innovation, determination, excellence- got to take their mums, dads and other family members to the Mercedes HQ at Brackley. It was a superb event and feedback has been incredibly positive. Families got a brilliant tour, the opportunity to network and to meet senior colleagues at MGP. Thanks to Yumna Khanam for organising and arranging this visit.





This week we are attending the Mercedes partners event at Silverstone- Paramjit Bhutta and two students from Mulberry Stepney Green will be representing the Trust at this exciting event.

This week we had our final PSG of the year. Each school reported back on the expected impact for cohort three. Whilst we are obviously awaiting exam outcomes due in August, the data at GCSE and A level is showing impressive predictions- average GCSE grade in Sciences/Maths predicted at grade 7+, Progress 8 for Science/Maths at over +1.0 and average A level grade B-.
