A group of five Year 11 and six Year 10 students recently joined Ms Alpdogan on an unforgettable trip to the Eurospace Centre in Belgium. This exciting journey included students from five schools: LAET, Park View, Gladesmore, Dukes, and Mulberry Academy Woodside.

The trip offered a unique blend of education and adventure. In the auditorium, students engaged with lectures on cosmology and the history of space exploration, expanding their knowledge of the universe.

At the space centre, the students participated in a variety of thrilling activities. They experienced the rush of a free fall slide, took part in a space mission simulation, and enjoyed rocket building and launching. They also walked on the moon and Mars through virtual reality, trained like astronauts on a multi-axis chair, and felt the effects of centripetal force in a space rotor.

No trip abroad would be complete without some cultural exploration. Our students took part in a flaming torch-lit tour of the medieval Bouillon Castle, adding a historical twist to their adventure. They also visited the famous Caves of Han, a stunning complex of limestone caves known for their incredible stalactites and stalagmites.



Year 7 Vegan Food Workshop

On Monday, July 15th, eleven Year 7 students attended an inspiring food workshop hosted by Made In Hackney. Established in 2012, Made In Hackney is the UK's first fully vegan community cookery school and charity, dedicated to promoting health, community, and environmental sustainability through plant-based cuisine.

During the workshop, our students had the opportunity to create delicious Nigerian meatpies using only plant-based ingredients. The results were astounding, with no pies left uneaten.

KEYSTAGES TEXTLESPROJECTS

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This term year 7, 8 and 9 students have been undertaking Textiles projects in D&T. Year 7 students designed and made Biomorphism themed wall hangings, year 8s created culturally inspired cushions and year 9 students produced tote bags decorated with test and imagery relating to social issues that resonated with them. Students used a variety of techniques including embroidery, applique and couching to create their finished pieces.





PRIMARY SCHOOL EVENT: SLIME WORKSHOPS

Students from local primary schools joined the Science Department to take part in a workshop on polymers. In the sessions, students learned about the differences between artificial and natural polymers and had the opportunity to take part in two practical activities.

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In the first activity students learned about DNA and then made their own models of a DNA strand which they were able to take home with them.

In the second activity things got messy, when students had the chance to make their own slime! Students took part in a competition to see whose slime could stretch the furthest. The students and the staff all had a slime-tastic time!



Author Event for Year 9 Students: An Introduction to GCSE History
