Year 7 Students Extract Their Own DNA at the Royal Institution

On Wednesday 14th May, thirty Year 7 students visited the Royal Institution for a hands-on science workshop in the L'Oréal Young Scientist Centre. The session focused on DNA, giving students the chance to extract and take home a sample of their own genetic material.

The experiment took place in a working laboratory just beneath Michael Faraday's preserved lab. Students followed each step carefully, using standard lab techniques to extract DNA from their own cheek cells. At the end of the session, each student sealed their DNA in a small necklace vial, a simple but striking way to see science in action.

As well as learning how to isolate DNA, students also gained a better understanding of cell structure and genetics. The visit gave them a valuable introduction to lab-based science, reinforcing some of the content they cover in school.

Thank you to the Royal Institution staff for leading the session and supporting our students throughout and to Dr. Hassan for organising this trip.

KEEPING YOUR CHILD SAFE ON THE WAY TO AND FROM SCHOOL

We want to make you aware of an increase in reports of mobile phone thefts in the local area, particularly targeting young people on their way to or from school. Your child's safety is our top priority, and we are taking this opportunity to share some important advice on how we can work together to keep our students safe. Please note that school staff do patrols after school every day.

Stay Alert and Aware

Encourage your child to avoid distractions like using their phone or wearing headphones while walking, especially in quiet or less busy areas.

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Keep Valuables Out of Sight

Mobile phones and other devices should be kept safely in bags or pockets and not used openly in public places unless absolutely necessary. Our advice is to leave expensive devices at home and instead use a cheap 'brick' phone.



Travel in Groups

Walking with friends or in a group is safer than walking alone. Where possible, arrange for your child to travel with classmates.



Stick to Well-Lit and Busy Routes

Encourage your child to take familiar, well-used routes and avoid shortcuts through isolated areas, especially during the darker hours.



Know Emergency Contacts

Make sure your child knows how to contact you or a trusted adult in case of an emergency. They should also be aware of how to contact the police (999 for emergencies, 101 for non-urgent matters).



Report Suspicious Behaviour

If your child feels unsafe or notices anything unusual, they should report it immediately to a trusted adult or member of school staff. You can also report concerns to the local police.

Working Together: We work as part of a network of schools in Haringey to keep unsafe behaviour off our streets. We are liaising with local authorities and the police to ensure increased vigilance and to support students' safety. Please take a moment to discuss these safety tips with your child. Awareness and preparation are key to prevention.




Next week is praise week which focuses on the Pupil Pillar: Ready to Achieve. You can support your child at home by:

- **Create a positive learning space**: Build your child's confidence by showing interest in their learning, encouraging effort, and celebrating progress.
- Keep learning engaging: Use everyday activities—like reading together, playing educational games, or exploring hobbies—to make learning fun and meaningful.





- Set clear goals and give encouragement: Help your child break down big tasks, stay organized, and offer positive, specific feedback as they work through challenges.
- Support social and emotional wellbeing: Talk openly about feelings, encourage kindness and cooperation, and help your child manage stress in healthy ways.
- Encourage independence and curiosity: Let your child make choices in their learning, ask questions, and reflect on what they've learned to build confidence and ownership.
