Year 7's attend the Food Lab workshop at LAET

On Tuesday, some of our Year 7 students attended The Food Lab, a brand-new afterschool science club exclusively for Year 7 students, hosted at the London Academy of Excellence Tottenham (LAET). This is a 4-week programme designed to spark curiosity and excitement about science through the lens of food, nutrition, and health.

Each week, students will take part in a different hands-on science activity related to food and the human body, among them testing food for different nutrients, measuring the energy content of snacks we eat, testing fruit juices for vitamins, and learning about freezing points by making ice cream (and eating it later).

This club is a fantastic opportunity for our Year 7 students to deepen their understanding of science in a fun, practical, and supportive environment, as well as getting acquainted with a potential 6th-form college they may attend in the future.

This week's in Action

Students being confident in their own skills and supporting each other

Next week our Values will focus on students being confident in their own skills and supporting each other. You can support child at home by:

- Celebrate small wins: Encourage your child to notice their progress, not just perfect results.
- Say: "I'm proud of the effort you put into that!" Tip: At the end of the day, ask: "What's one thing you did today that made you feel proud?"
- Help each other learn: Remind your child that learning happens in everyday moments with family. Say: "Can you show your sibling how you did that?" Tip: Involve them in helping others with tasks like reading to a younger sibling or sharing a skill





- Take on roles and responsibilities: Give your child simple responsibilities to build confidence. Say: "Can you be in charge of setting the table today?" Tip: Rotate household tasks and call them "important jobs" to make them feel valuable
 - Give kind and helpful feedback: Teach your child how to be kind and honest when talking to others. Say: "What's something nice you can say, and one way to help them do better next time?" Tip: Practice this when playing games or working on projects together




