Form 9Y Shines in First Give Charity Event

This term, our entire Year 9 cohort took part in the inspiring First Give programme, a nationwide initiative that encourages young people to engage with social issues and make a real difference in their communities. The project has seen weeks of preparation, teamwork, and creativity come together in a fantastic final event that celebrated the generosity, compassion, and hard work of our students.

Each Year 9 form class selected a charity to support, ranging from local causes to national organisations doing vital work. As part of the project, students worked in teams to research their chosen charity, meet with charity representatives, and design compelling presentations to raise awareness of the issues these charities tackle. Their goal was not just to learn, but to inspire action and empathy.



Over the course of the project, students also organised fundraising activities, bringing in an impressive total of over £800 for their various charities. From bake sales to sponsored challenges, their dedication was truly heartwarming.

The final, held in our school hall, was a moving and exciting culmination of all their efforts. Each form class was represented by a group of presenters who confidently delivered their well-researched presentations to a panel of special guests. We were honoured to have MP Bambos Charalambous



join the judging panel, alongside other community figures. Among the audience was Hibo Wardere, an anti-FGM campaigner and speaker, who attended as a guest linked to one of the charities supported.

The standard of presentations was incredibly high, and the competition was tight. After much deliberation, Form 9Y was announced as the winner, securing a £1,000 cheque for their chosen charity, CASWA. Their presentation impressed the judges with its depth of knowledge, emotional impact, and professional delivery.

Adding to the atmosphere of the event, two of our talented students performed piano pieces, giving the audience a moment of reflection and adding a beautiful musical touch to the occasion.

This event was not just a competition; it was a celebration of kindness, teamwork, and the power of young people to make a difference. We are incredibly proud of all our Year 9 students for their hard work and commitment. The First Give programme has not only raised money but also helped nurture empathy, leadership, and a deeper connection to the world around us.

STEM Day Challenge: Powering the Future with Renewable Energy





60 of our enthusiastic Year 8 and 9 students took part in a full-day, hands-on challenge focused on Renewable Energy.

During the day, students stepped into the shoes of engineers, designers, and environmental planners as they worked in teams to tackle a real-world challenge on: How to generate and deliver clean, renewable energy to a small village.

Each team:

- Chose a renewable energy source
- Built a working device to generate electricity
- Designed an energy transmission route to local homes
- Considered the social and environmental impact of their project
- Hosted a public forum to present their solution to the community

This immersive experience explored Science and Technology - it introduced students to a range of exciting STEM careers and helped them build key skills in teamwork, problem-solving, and communication.

We were glad to see our students rise to the challenge and showcase their creativity and innovation in building a cleaner, brighter future!

"Voices of Woodside" Podcast Launches with Year 7 Reflections


We're excited to launch our very first school podcast: Voices of Woodside.
