

An Unforgettable Journey into Ancient Athens




This week, our students had the chance to step back in time as they explored the history and myths of Athens.
















Year 7 witness the magic of chemistry

Year 7 & 8 STEM Maths Workshop

This week, 50 year 7 and 8 students took part in an exciting STEM workshop. This workshop is designed to stretch their problem- solving skills and show how mathematics connects to wider world of science, technology, and engineering. Students worked in teams to tackle hands-on challenges, from logic puzzles and number investigation to real life problem scenarios. The activities encouraged collaboration, critical thinking, and creativity skills that are essential not only in maths but across all STEM subjects.

The workshop gave pupils the chance to see maths in action beyond the classroom and appreciate its importance in everyday life and future careers. It was wonderful to see so much enthusiasm with students engaging confidently and sharing their strategies with one another.







This week's Action Corridor Code

Next week, our values focus will be on the Corridor Code. This is an important part of helping pupils move safely and respectfully around school so that lessons stay calm and learning is not disrupted. You can support your child at home in simple ways:

Explain why

Talk to your child about the reason behind the Corridor Code. Explain that it keeps everyone safe, makes the school feel calm, and helps lessons start on time. Children are more likely to follow rules when they understand the purpose.

Practise at home

Use your hallway or a clear space at home to practise walking quietly, keeping to one side, and moving calmly. This helps your child get used to what is expected in school.





Give reminders

A quick reminder before they leave for school can make a big difference. Phrases such as "Remember calm walking today" or "Voices off in the corridor" keep the message fresh in their mind.

Praise good effort

Notice when your child tries to follow the code, even if it isn't perfect. A small word of praise or encouragement will build their confidence and motivation to keep practising.

Link to real life

Help your child see that the Corridor Code is not just for school. Remind them it's the same as moving quietly in places like libraries, shops, or museums where calm behaviour is expected.



During production, a typical day is between 10 and 12 hours. However, as a director you will usually spend extra time in meetings discussing aspects of the production.
