A summit CELEBRATING INTERNATIONAL DAY OF THE GIRL 2025

Friday 10th October 2025

On Friday 10th October, 21 girls from year 10 attended the 2nd annual Global Girl Leading summit at Mulberry School for Girls.

The purpose of the summit is to empower girls with the knowledge, skills, experience and capacity to deal constructively and powerfully with gender inequality and discrimination when they encounter it. Global Girl Leading supports girls' intellectual and personal development so that they can achieve self-determination, having the power of choice in their lives.







There were a range of inspiring speakers from Women's Leadership at Local, National and International Levels, as well as workshops led by diverse organisations, focused on changemaking skills. There were premieres of student projects, including a film screening and poetry performance.

10 of the girls were selected as leaders within the summit, where the students took on various roles, including logistics management, speaker support, and compering. It was a packed day, filled with lots of insight, teamwork and knowledge



POSITIVE BODY LANGUAGE

NEXT WEEK, OUR SCHOOL VALUES FOCUS ON USING POSITIVE BODY LANGUAGE — AN IMPORTANT SKILL FOR SHOWING CONFIDENCE, RESPECT, AND FOCUS.

YOU CAN SUPPORT YOUR CHILD AT HOME BY:

SET THE EXAMPLE

CHILDREN LEARN BEST BY WATCHING THE ADULTS AROUND THEM MODEL CONFIDENT AND OPEN BODY LANGUAGE — STAND TALL, KEEP YOUR HEAD UP, MAKE EYE CONTACT WHEN LISTENING OR SPEAKING, AND USE OPEN GESTURES, YOUR CHILD WILL NATURALLY BEGIN TO COPY THESE BEHAVIOURS IN THEIR OWN INTERACTIONS.

TALK ABOUT IT

HAVE A SHORT CONVERSATION WITH YOUR CHILD ABOUT HOW BODY LANGUAGE CAN AFFECT THE WAY OTHERS SEE US, FOR EXAMPLE. CROSSING ARMS MIGHT MAKE SOMEONE APPEAR UNAPPROACHABLE. WHILE SMILING AND MAKING EYE CONTACT SHOWS INTEREST AND CONFIDENCE, HELP THEM UNDERSTAND THAT COMMUNICATION ISN'T JUST ABOUT WHAT WE SAY, BUT ALSO HOW WE SAY IT.

USE EXAMPLES

BODY LANGUAGE IS ALL AROUND US — IN FILMS, ON TV, AND IN
EVERYDAY LIFE, POINT IT OUT WHEN YOU SEE IT:
'DID YOU NOTICE HOW THAT PERSON LOOKED UNSURE WHEN THEY
AVOIDED EYE CONTACT?'

THESE SMALL OBSERVATIONS CAN HELP CHILDREN RECOGNISE
THE SIGNALS THEY SEND THROUGH THEIR OWN BODY LANGUAGE.

GIVE SUPPORTIVE FEEDBACK

IF YOU NOTICE YOUR CHILD LOOKING CLOSED OFF OR UNCOMFORTABLE IN A SOCIAL SETTING, GENTLY ENCOURAGE THEM TO ADJUST — FOR EXAMPLE, STANDING UP STRAIGHT, RELAXING THEIR SHOULDERS, OR SMILING, JUST AS IMPORTANTLY, PRAISE THEM WHEN THEY SHOW CONFIDENT, OPEN BEHAVIOUR, POSITIVE REINFORCEMENT HELPS THESE HABITS STICK.



WHE I HER IT'S PREPARING FOR A CLASS PRESENT A HON, AN INTERVIEW, OR MEETING NEW PEOPLE, PRACTICE MAKES A BIG DIFFERENCE, ENCOURAGE YOUR CHILD TO STAND TALL, SMILE, AND SPEAK CLEARLY, YOU COULD EVEN ROLE-PLAY SHORT SCENARIOS AT HOME TO HELP THEM BUILD COMFORT AND CONFIDENCE.

- Any breach of examination conditions is considered as <u>malpractice</u>* and can lead to <u>DISQUALIFICATION!</u>




