Students represented the school well and made the most of the experience, combining entertainment with curiosity and discussion.

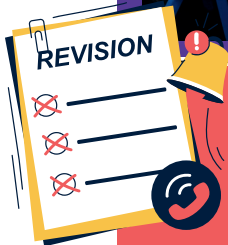


## Students Explore Future Pathways with IntoUniversity

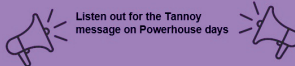

# Safeguarding

## Diversity and Respecting Differences

Talk with your child about respecting differences in race, religion, culture and identity. Help them understand that everyone's experiences and backgrounds are unique and should be valued. Encourage open conversations and challenge stereotypes or negative comments when they arise. Remind your child that kindness, empathy and inclusion matter both in person and online. Support them to stand up for others in a respectful way and to seek help if they see or experience discrimination. Building awareness at home helps children develop into respectful, inclusive members of the community.

# ATTENDANCE TOP TIP FOR PARENTS

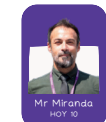
## MANAGE TIME

Aquaponics is a sustainable food production system that combines aquaculture (the raising of fish) with hydroponics (the growing of plants in water).

Aquaponics technicians are responsible for the day-to-day operation of aquaponics systems, including feeding the fish, monitoring water quality, and harvesting the plants.
