Students explored the history of the famous theatre alongside the River Thames, learning about William Shakespeare and the growth of the theatre industry during his time. The tour also introduced students to the theatre's unique design and the work that went into rebuilding the Globe centuries after the original theatre was destroyed by fire.

The visit gave students the chance to experience an important part of literary history beyond the classroom and deepen their understanding of Shakespeare's world.

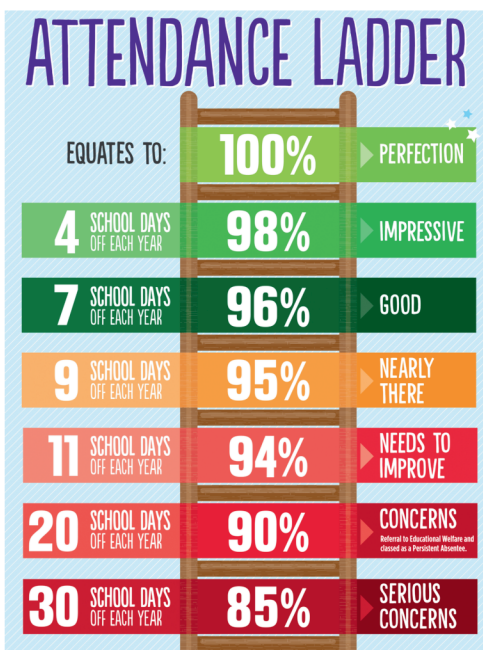

DEVELOP CONFIDENCE WHEN SPEAKING IN PUBLIC

NEXT WEEK, OUR VALUES SESSION WILL FOCUS ON HELPING STUDENTS DEVELOP CONFIDENCE WHEN SPEAKING IN PUBLIC AND SHARING THEIR IDEAS WITH OTHERS.

KEEP A SIMPLE ROUTINE

TRY TO MAINTAIN REGULAR BEDTIMES AND WAKE-UP TIMES WHERE POSSIBLE. CHILDREN SETTLE BACK INTO SCHOOL MORE EASILY WHEN SLEEP ROUTINES STAY CONSISTENT. A CALM STRUCTURE DURING THE BREAK CAN ALSO HELP SUPPORT WELLBEING, FOCUS AND ENERGY LEVELS.

ENCOURAGE READING

SET ASIDE A LITTLE TIME EACH DAY FOR READING. WHETHER THAT IS BOOKS, COMICS, MAGAZINES, ARTICLES OR RECIPES, READING REGULARLY HELPS IMPROVE VOCABULARY, CONCENTRATION AND CONFIDENCE, WHILE ALSO ENCOURAGING CURIOSITY AND IMAGINATION.

PRACTICE KEY SKILLS

SHORT BURSTS OF MATHS PRACTICE, HANDWRITING, SPELLING OR REVISION CAN HELP KEEP IMPORTANT SKILLS FRESH. KEEP ACTIVITIES RELAXED AND MANAGEABLE THROUGH GAMES, QUIZZES, FLASHCARDS OR QUICK DAILY CHALLENGES RATHER THAN LONG STUDY SESSIONS.

TALK ABOUT THE NEW TERM

SPEND TIME DISCUSSING WHAT YOUR CHILD IS LOOKING FORWARD TO WHEN THEY RETURN TO SCHOOL. POSITIVE CONVERSATIONS ABOUT FRIENDSHIPS, SUBJECTS, CLUBS OR GOALS CAN HELP REDUCE WORRIES AND BUILD CONFIDENCE AHEAD OF THE NEW HALF TERM.

GET ORGANISED EARLY

USE THE FINAL DAYS OF THE BREAK TO PREPARE FOR THE RETURN TO SCHOOL. CHECKING UNIFORMS, ORGANISING EQUIPMENT, PACKING BAGS AND PLANNING LUNCHES IN ADVANCE CAN HELP THE FIRST FEW MORNINGS FEEL CALMER AND MORE POSITIVE FOR THE WHOLE FAMILY.

As we approach the final half term of the academic year, we would like to take this opportunity to remind all Year 10 students and their families of the importance of the upcoming mock examinations, which will begin in the week commencing 15th June. These mocks are a significant milestone in your academic journey and provide a valuable opportunity to gauge progress, identify strengths, and address areas for improvement well ahead of your final GCSE examinations.

Mock exams are not simply a practice; they are a stepping stone to success. They allow students to experience exam conditions, develop effective revision strategies, and build the resilience and confidence needed for the real exams next year. As the saying goes, "Success is where preparation and opportunity meet". The time you invest in your revision now will directly influence the outcomes you achieve.

We strongly encourage all students to begin preparing early and to use their time wisely over the half term. While it is important to rest, recharge, and look after your wellbeing, it is equally important to establish a structured revision timetable. A well-balanced approach, combining rest with focused study, will not only reduce stress but also maximise your productivity. "Little and often beats last minute cramming." Short, consistent revision sessions are far more effective than trying to cover everything at the last minute.

You should make full use of the topic lists that have been shared previously. These have been carefully designed by subject Head of Departments to guide revision and ensure that all key content is covered. Revisiting these topics, practising exam questions, and seeking help where needed will all contribute to stronger performance. Remember, "Revision is the key to success." It is the bridge between learning and achievement.

How parents and carers can support revision daily:

- Establish a routine and encourage a clear revision timetable.
- Provide a quiet and organised study space.
- Check in daily and ask what has been revised.
- Ensure access to topic lists and revision materials.
- Encourage good sleep, healthy eating, and breaks.
- Praise effort and progress to build motivation.

Managing exam stress – tips for students:

- Stick to a clear revision plan.
- Break tasks into smaller chunks.
- Take regular breaks.
- Stay active.
- Talk to someone if feeling overwhelmed.
- Keep a positive mindset.

For students, this is your opportunity to demonstrate your progress and show what you are capable of achieving. Focus on doing your best, not on perfection. Every step forward counts. "Progress, not perfection, is what leads to long-term success."

As we head into the half-term break, we wish you all a restful and enjoyable holiday. Take time to relax and recharge—but do not lose sight of your goals. A balance of rest and revision is essential.

Remember: the effort you put in now will pay off.
