We also had the first of two trips to Go Ape with Year 7, which developed students' skills in communication, confidence and resilience.

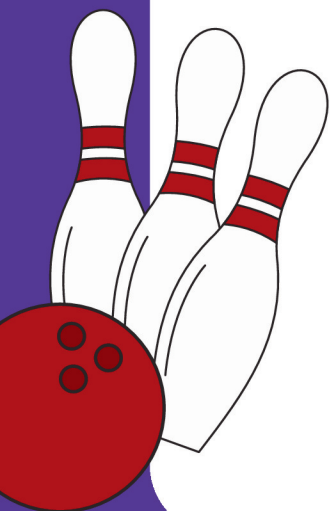

# Safeguarding Online Challenges and Scam Awareness

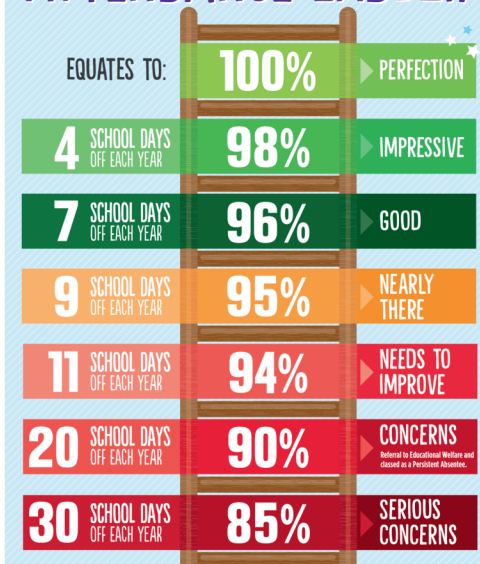

# NEXT WEEK'S VALUES IN ACTION

## BEING RESPECTFUL OF OTHERS BELIEFS

NEXT WEEK OUR VALUES SESSION WILL FOCUS ON BEING RESPECTFUL OF OTHERS BELIEFS. YOU CAN SUPPORT YOUR CHILD AT HOME BY:

### ENCOURAGE YOUR CHILD TO LISTEN CAREFULLY TO OTHERS

TEACH YOUR CHILD TO LISTEN WITH AN OPEN MIND WHEN OTHERS ARE SHARING THEIR BELIEFS OR OPINIONS. REMIND THEM THAT LISTENING RESPECTFULLY HELPS THEM UNDERSTAND DIFFERENT PERSPECTIVES AND SHOWS CONSIDERATION FOR OTHERS.

### MODEL RESPECTFUL LANGUAGE AND BEHAVIOUR

CHILDREN OFTEN LEARN BY WATCHING ADULTS. USE RESPECTFUL LANGUAGE WHEN DISCUSSING PEOPLE WITH DIFFERENT BELIEFS. AND ENCOURAGE YOUR CHILD TO AVOID TEASING, JUDGING, OR MAKING NEGATIVE COMMENTS ABOUT OTHERS' VIEWS.

### ENCOURAGE CURIOSITY AND RESPECTFUL QUESTIONS

HELP YOUR CHILD UNDERSTAND THAT IT IS OKAY TO ASK QUESTIONS ABOUT BELIEFS THAT ARE DIFFERENT FROM THEIR OWN. ENCOURAGE THEM TO ASK POLITELY AND WITH GENUINE INTEREST SO THEY CAN LEARN FROM OTHERS AND DEVELOP EMPATHY.

### TEACH ACCEPTANCE OF DIFFERENCES

EXPLAIN THAT PEOPLE COME FROM DIFFERENT BACKGROUNDS, CULTURES, RELIGIONS, AND EXPERIENCES, WHICH CAN INFLUENCE WHAT THEY BELIEVE. HELP YOUR CHILD UNDERSTAND THAT RESPECTING OTHERS DOES NOT REQUIRE AGREEING WITH THEM; IT MEANS TREATING THEM WITH KINDNESS AND DIGNITY.



### FOCUS ON SHARED VALUES

TALK WITH YOUR CHILD ABOUT THE VALUES THAT PEOPLE OFTEN HAVE IN COMMON, SUCH AS KINDNESS, HONESTY, RESPECT, AND FAIRNESS. EMPHASISING THESE SHARED VALUES CAN HELP THEM BUILD POSITIVE RELATIONSHIPS WITH PEOPLE FROM DIVERSE BACKGROUNDS.

## Year 10 Final Exams – Revision Tips

### Make the Most of Your Revision Pack

You have been given some powerful revision tools. Use them well to help you prepare for your exams.

### Cornell Notebooks

- Use the left-hand column for key questions or keywords.
- Write detailed notes in the main section.
- Add a short summary at the bottom.
- Cover your notes and test yourself using the questions.

### Flashcards

- Write a question on one side and the answer on the other.
- Keep each card focused on one key idea.
- Use them regularly for self-testing.
- Ask a friend or family member to quiz you.

### Highlighters

- Highlight key vocabulary, dates, formulas and concepts.
- Be selective and avoid highlighting too much.
- Use different colours to organise information.

### Top Revision Tips

1. Start early and stay consistent
2. Little and often is more effective than last-minute cramming.
3. Revise actively
4. Test yourself using flashcards, quizzes and past questions.
5. Practise exam questions
6. Time yourself to build confidence and improve exam technique.
7. Focus on weaker topics
8. Spend extra time on areas you find difficult.
9. Stay organised and look after yourself
10. Keep resources tidy, get enough sleep, eat well and take regular breaks.

Stay positive, work hard and keep going. Every revision session brings you one step closer to success.
